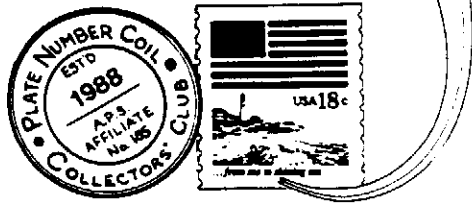

PNC3 Annual Meeting report

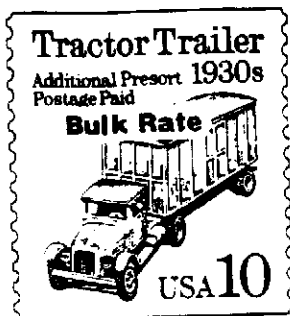
The Plate Number Coil Collectors Club continues to move forward but a fair amount of the Annual Meeting was spent talking about the basic idea of sharing information to the benefit of everyone.

President Tom Maeder set the tone when he opened the meeting and asked all of the 45 attending to introduce themselves and share their collecting interests.

The club in the Lawrence Convention Center in downtown Pittsburgh the afternoon of Saturday, Aug. 22.

Leonard Piskiewicz of Santa Clara, CA gave the most extensive report, detailing his search for examples of private overprints of using the Tractor Trailer stamp. He's developed a "wanted" poster illustrating the objects of the search. He's looking for mint strips, errors and varieties, usage on covers and information on suppliers of the overprints.

These are the illustrations he is using on the poster.

Maeder announced the club will be doing its part to keep inflation down with the dues structure remaining the same since organization. Although the USPS is planning the third rate increase since we organized, the board saw no reason to raise dues.

One way members can help is to patronize those dealers advertising in *Coil Line*. Let them know you are a member. Advertising revenue needs to grow to help offset printing costs. (A plug from the editor).

There is also discussion about making the PNC3 logo a registered trademark. The cost of this could be high

but if anyone can help out, contact anyone on the board with information.

An idea to use some of the funds collected from life memberships toward manufacture and sale of PNC3-related items is being kicked about. A survey of the membership will be included in a future edition of *Coil Line*. Possibilities are stationary, cachets, pins and even T-shirts. Profits would go back into the special fund that has been created for the life membership money. The board has designated not more than 10 percent of the life membership money can be put into the general fund in any fiscal year.

Ron Maifeld of Cincinnati suggested the club purchase more PNC pins. Since the original supply was sold, new members do not have the opportunity to do so. It was also suggested that

Achievement Awards presented to four members at Pittsburgh

Alan Thomson, Dr. Joseph Agris, Carl Ditsch and Rob Washburn received Achievement Awards during the Annual Meeting of the Plate Number Coil Collectors Club Aug. 22 in Pittsburgh.

The awards were presented by Bill McMurray, chair of the club's Awards and Exhibition Committee. He also presented outgoing President Tom Maeder with a plaque to commemorate his two-year term of leadership.

For more than four years Thomson has been in charge of having *Coil Line* printed and then mailing it after the page proofs are received from Editor Harold Brown.

Thomson called the job, which averages 25 to 30 hours a month "a labor of love" after the presentation.

The other three recipients could not attend the session.

Agris recently gave the club a series of six programs he has developed on Plate Number Coils and related topics. All of these are available for member use.

Ditsch and Washburn recently published the *Purple Machine Cancel Handbook*, which details the early 1980s era of those cancels and is very relevant to PNC collecting.

New Plate Number Coil Catalog in final stages

Yes, there will be a new *Plate Number Coil Catalog*. Plate Number Coil Collectors Club members attending the Annual Meeting heard details from Editor and Publisher Rich Nazar.

Some members also got a brief glimpse of the catalog. It looks like it will be worth the long wait.

Nazar said the catalog will run to about 250 pages and preliminary indications are the cost will be in the \$20 to \$25 range. He hopes to have it spiral bound and is also planning a limited hardback edition, possibly for under \$50.

While plans call for publication late this year, Nazar is still looking for items to add. He left his specific list at home but did provide addresses and phone numbers for anyone who thinks they may have a rare or elusive item that ought to be included.

He hopes to have the catalog finished in time for the ASDA Mega Show in New York this fall.

"It's been a lot to do but there is much more that can be done. It's been a difficult chore but I think everybody will be happy when they have it in their hands. Tell me what you're interested in seeing in the catalog," Nazar said.

"Already I can't wait to get it out to everybody just to hear 'I've got one of those' but it's not illustrated," Nazar said.

Take the hint members, the wait has been long but you can be part of the final product. Nazar will acknowledge those who have contributed. Ordering details will be announced.

Auction results & request for lots

PNC³ Auction Manager Joe Sedivy has submitted the results of Club Auction No. 11, which closed June 18. Details are also included with his report.

At the same time Joe has issued a call for lots for the next two auctions. Auction 12 will be a specialty auction limited to mint plate number strips of 3 and 5. Lots must be received by Sept. 20.

a better quality pin might be developed to wear on sport jackets, etc.

Several members encouraged reporting finds and other information to *Coil Line* first, rather than other philatelic publications. "*Coil Line* is only as good as we (the members) make it," Richard Beecher of Los Angeles said. "It is only as diverse and interesting as we make it."

With a monthly deadline and the lead time required for columns in even the weekly publications, PNC3 members can expect to get the information as quick as any other publication, provided *Coil Line* is informed, Maeder said.

One of the early features of *Coil Line* was reports on the Philatelic Windows across the country. This feature may be revived this fall and winter. But the first goal is trying to get an accurate list of the windows actually in operation. Details will be announced.

Additional details from the Annual Meeting will be published in the October issue. Coverage in this issue was written up by the editor in a copy shop in downtown Pittsburgh. Now, it's back to Stampshow.

White House color varieties

To the Editor:

This is in response to the letter in the August issue of *Coil Line* from Wayne Meyers on the subject of color varieties in the White House coil.

Wayne described the stamps found by Joe Sedivy as appearing "violet or purple." I have not seen any of Joe's stamps, but have obtained a pair of the ones found by Rick Staiger, who advertised them as indigo, and find that they do have a purplish cast to them.

Wayne speculated that Joe's stamps' color "may have been due to a contamination between the blue and red inks." Writing in the same issue, Joann Lenz suggested that "the indigo varieties in the White House might have been a trial run after the Flanigan." Joann referred to the 4c Flanigan color as indigo. Scott calls it blue violet and TPN has called the tagged version violet blue while saying that the untagged version is bluer. Since shades can vary some throughout a printing and since I don't have a bunch of different copies of the Flanigan, I can not comment on whether there are two distinct shades for Flanigan, but I did compare the stamps from Rick with my Flanigans and found them to be very similar (and far different from the normal range of WH shades).

In conclusion: 1) There is definitely some confusion about what color name to assign to the more recent finds. 2) My vote is for the Flanigan theory over the red getting into the blue theory.

Still nothing to match "indigo" find

To the Editor:

The following is in regards to the recent discovery by Rick Staiger of what he calls the "Indigo" variety of the 28c White House coil. After seeing Mr. Staiger's ad in *Linn's Stamp News* I was very excited and sent in my check for a pair of the latest find. I received my "Indigo" pair in the main Aug. 3 and wasn't that surprised that Staiger's stamps were not the same color as the original discovery.

I've compared Staiger's stamps to the "Indigo" and the "Navy Blue" varieties originally discovered by Ron Kronheim of Rita Kay Quality Stamps of New York. Staiger's stamps simply do not match. However, they do match perfectly the stamps recently discovered by Joe Sedivy, PNC3 auction manager. Sedivy's stamps, which he calls "Chicago Blue" are in my opinion a purplish color, possible a contamination between the blue and red inks during printing.

Staiger has also submitted a PNC5 to the APS for expertizing (The PF has issued certificates for the

"Indigo" and "Navy Blue") and I congratulate him on his discovery. However, I believe that the "Indigo" stamp still remains elusive, only one roll that was slit for destruction has ever been found.

The "Indigo," "Navy Blue," and now "Chicago Blue" still remain a mystery until the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) renders its opinion.

PNC3 - 5555, 5556, 6667, 7676, 7679, 7766, 7779.

This could really be a problem for new collectors who might search for that elusive number.

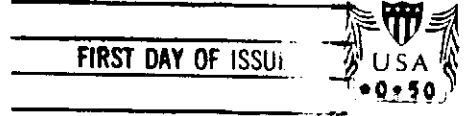
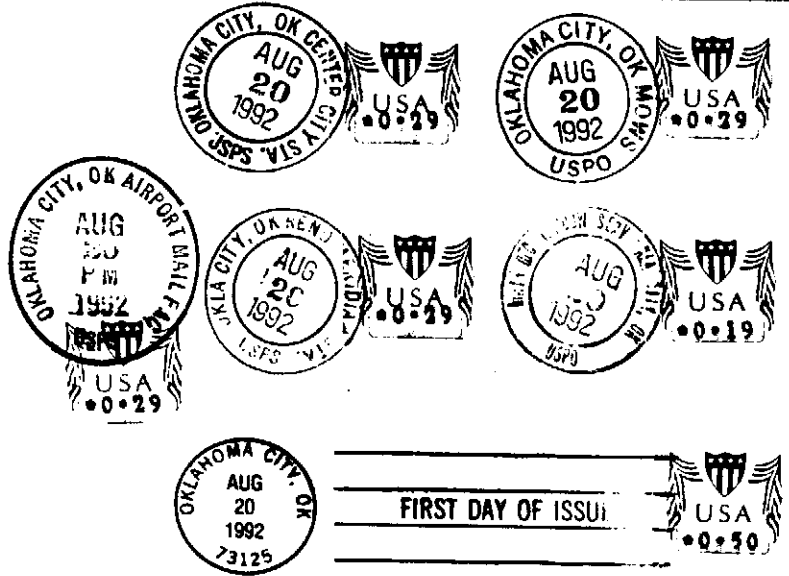

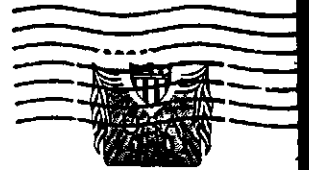

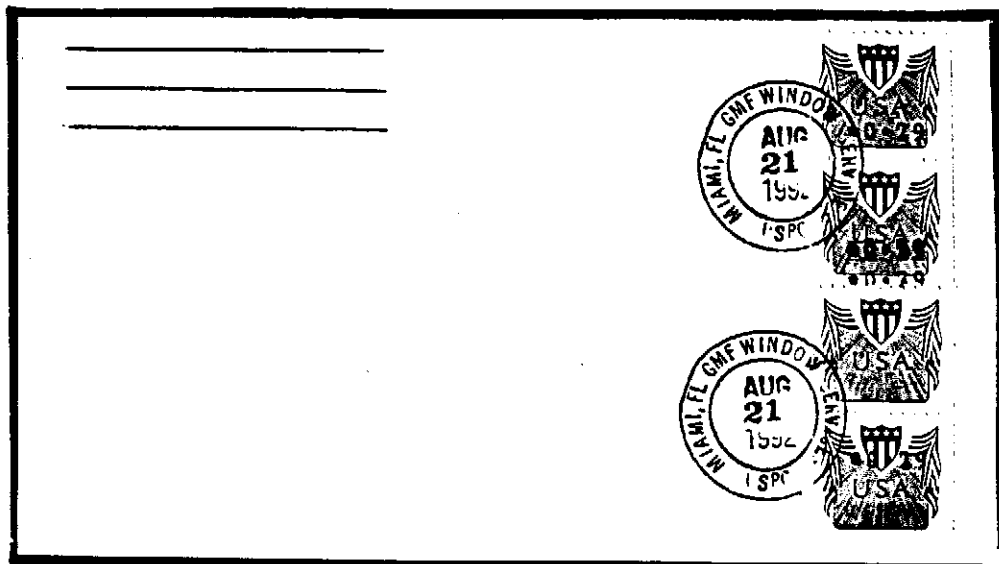


POSTAGE DUE 28¢

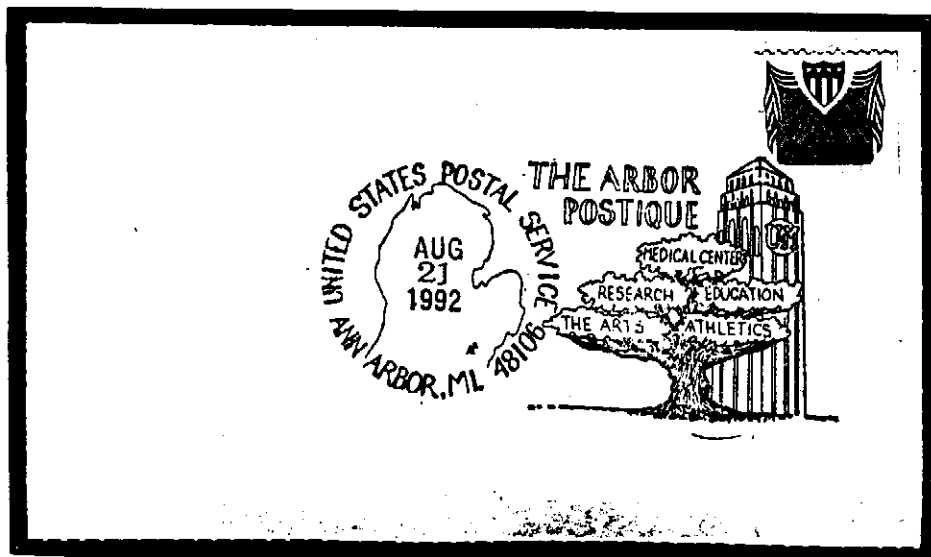

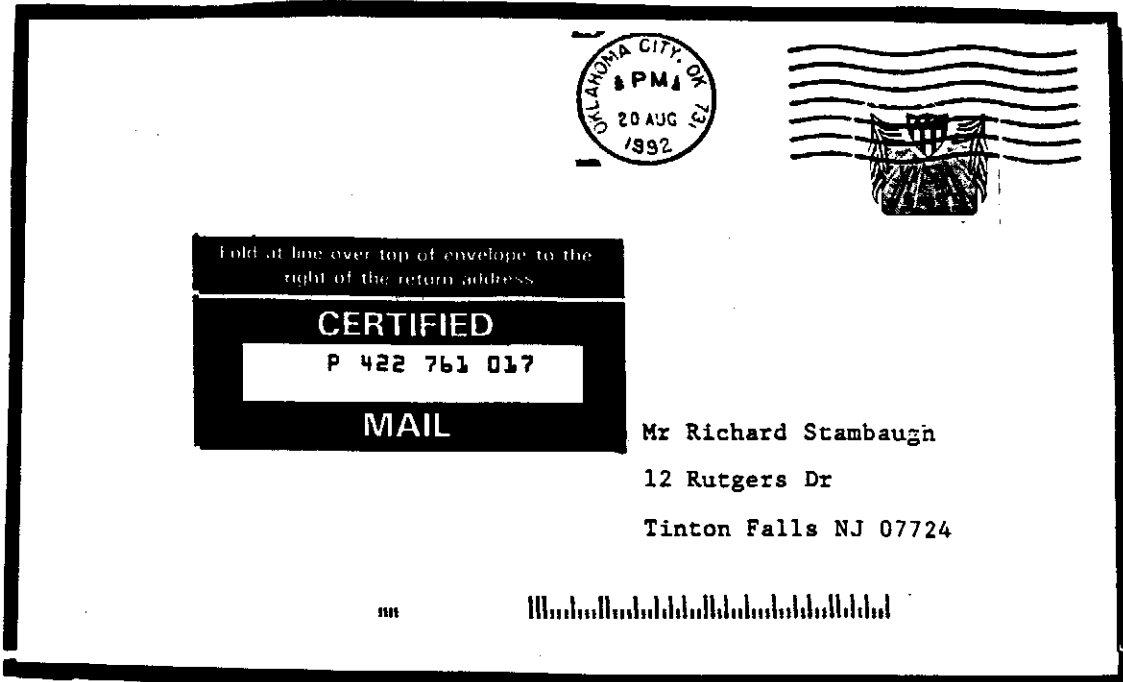

First day of usage pictorial cancel introduces us to the postcard rate with a plate number single: a third city along the first day back road.





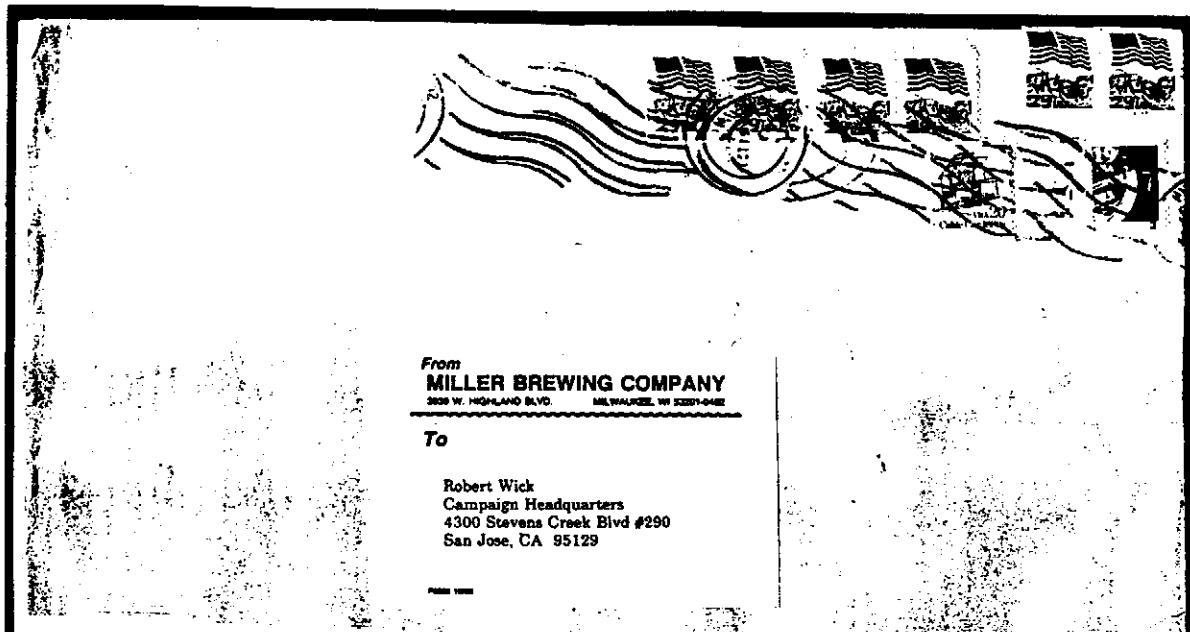
My personal favorite is this certified usage that shows the only August 20th machine cancel known to me.

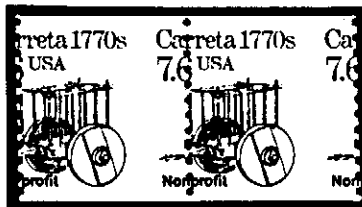
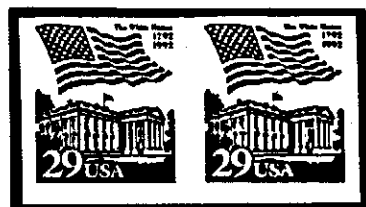
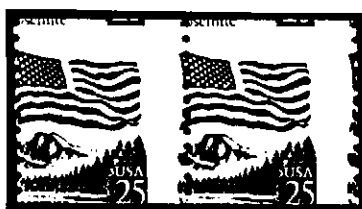
