PNC³ Annual Meeting Aug. 24 in Orlando during APS Stampshow '96

Gene Ernst, president of the Plate Number Coil Collectors Club has announced the tentative times for the Annual Meeting during Stampshow in Orlando, FL.

The club has requested a meeting time of 1 to 3 p.m. The location and time have yet to be confirmed by APS. The board plans to meet with 10 a.m. until noon, take a break for lunch and then convene the club meeting.

Gene plans to hold a discussion on the new self adhesive coils. He planned to attend TEXPEX June 15 when six new coils were slated to be released. By observation, he hopes to obtain some first hand information and knowledge.

He would like members to let him know how they plan to collect and mount these coils.

"All of us would be interested in when the first "TRUE" commercial self adhesive plate number coil is found. Remember, there are rolls of 10,000 being issue specifically for the bulk mailers," Gene said.

In a letter dated June 1, Gene noted that in mid-May he had received a tagged Eagle and Shield #2221 on a 'card holder only' mailing from Montgomery Wards. Additional details on the annual meeting will be published in the August *Coil Line*.

Partially inverted back number-not ending in zero

Joseph L. Simmons of 3107 Venter Ave., Longport, N.J. has provided the illustration below. On May 24 he found a cover from Prudential Bank, P.O. Box 105899, Atlanta, GA 30348-5899 with Eagle & Shield back number on top.

The first two numbers appear normal, the next three numbers appear inverted and do not end in a zero. Closer examination shows all numbers to be inverted. The stamp is a BEP issue.

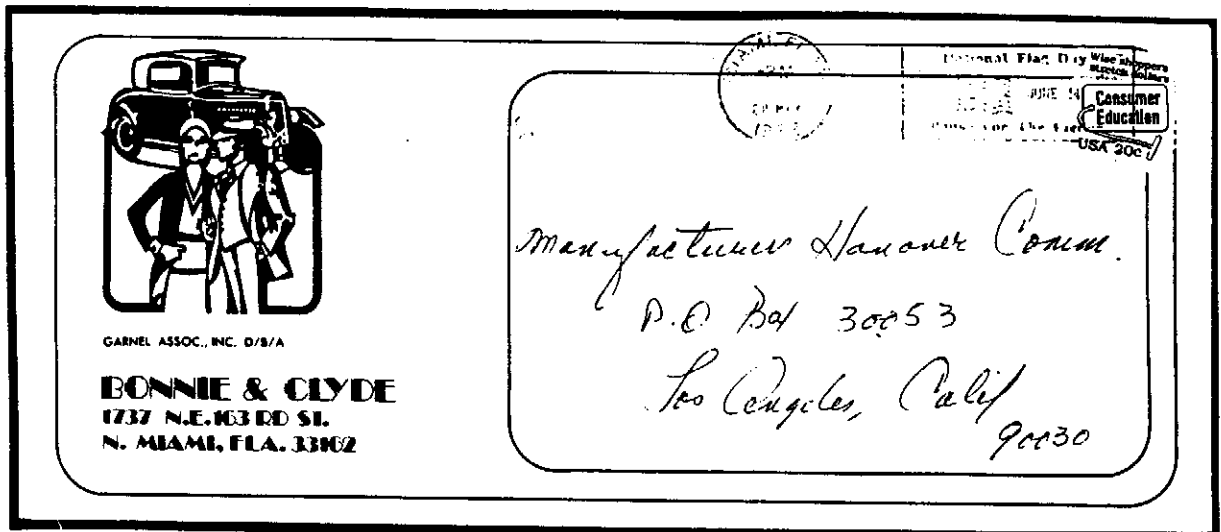
22c Flag #5. Though a common plate number to find on cover, the added illustrated corner card definitely increases this cover's appeal and value.

In the meantime, we'll be looking for any and all reports on the self-adhesive coils that show up in your neighborhoods.

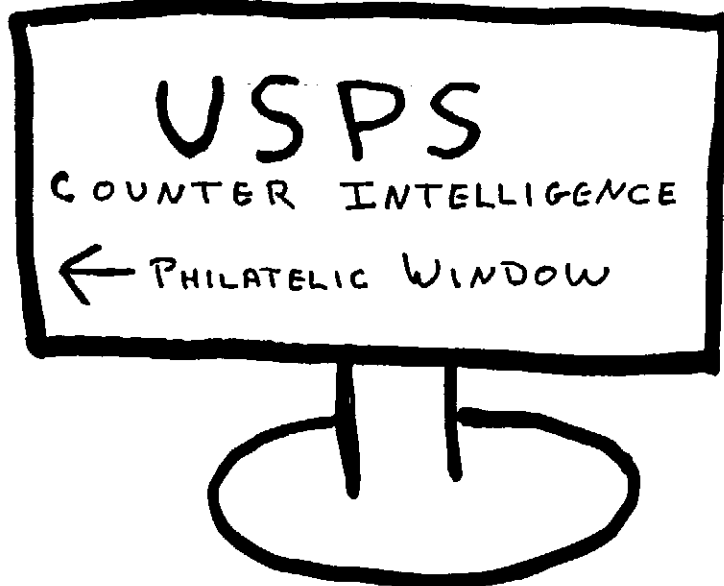
President Gene Ernst planned to attend the first day event at TEXPEX, but that doesn't mean he's the only one who can contribute.
