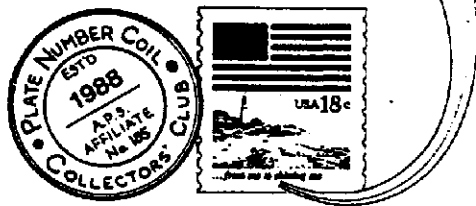

Recent additions to club services

During the last couple of months, we have made a few changes to improve our services to our members. These are made possible largely because more members have stepped forward to work on projects or committees that held some interest for them.

I'd like to thank all members who took the time, via the survey sent out at the end of last year, and in response to last month's column, to offer their thoughts on club operations, and possible ways to improve them. Many of those ideas are within the scope of the current club structure, but others would require substantive changes. All suggestions will be carefully considered.

As you will recall, the survey contained a section for members to indicate their interest in serving on committees. As a result, a number of committees have new chairpersons. These new leaders will be developing new approaches to the way your club serves your collecting needs, and I have every reason to believe that you will agree. Ken Moreau is looking for confirmation that the black mark on the 1R stamp is a constant plate variety. Does anyone else have one?

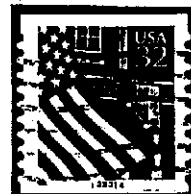


Additional 13231A VP's found

New Numbers

The 21¢ Bison coil is out with its first number of V1111. The denominated Statue of Liberty coil has added a total of three new numbers, one of which is the large roll #2222 (with space between). Rolls of 100 of the SOL are coming fast with #2222 and #3333 having been found.

Other Hat "Hoppers" Found

Cylinder combination #2222 of the PSA Hat stamp with a hopping digit in the number has been found by Doug Iams. Its appearance is very similar to the #1111 example shown last month, with the hat band shifted off to the left. This puts the blue 2 ahead of the red 2. Unfortunately the person who clipped it from its envelope cut the top margin. Doug not only found this used example but also found a PS5 of the shift in a dealer's stock. He has since sold the strip to another collector. This mint strip is the first hopper, either Porch Flag or Hat, to be found in that condition.



Dates Large and Small

Changes in the size and font of dates on coil stamps seem to occupy a large amount of our time these days. Most of the time the printer starts out with a year date that's too small and when new plates are made for further printing, the size is increased. Rob Loeffler found that stamps from the BEP's Green Bike issue have two different sizes of the 1998 date. He hadn't determined where, in relation to plate numbers, this occurred. I checked my collection and extras and found that numbers 111 through 555 have small dates. Plate numbers 666 through 999 appear to have only large dates. So far no one has reported finding a given plate number with both sizes. If you find one, let us know.

A New CPV from the Porch Flag

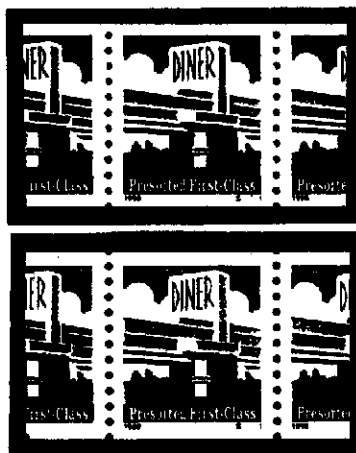
We don't often hear from our members who live outside the US, and it was nice to receive an item of interest from Marc Anthony, who is from Wales, UK. Marc has turned up a new constant variety of the water activated gum Porch Flag with cylinder combination 66646. He found several copies whose plate numbers appear as 6664.6/. The dot between the 4 and the 6 and the virgule at the end are both in red ink.

Blue Jay Dropped from Chart

The 20¢ Blue Jay has been dropped from the roll chart. The Jay is just about gone and there are two other 20¢ coils in adequate supply. There is a large enough inventory of the Pheasant and Cog Railway to delay printing the new 20¢ Washington coil.

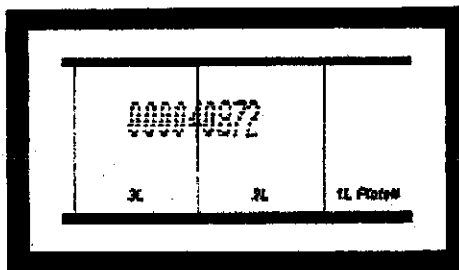
Diner Holes

In the September 2000 issue of Coil Line there was a list of five PNC issues that have been found with both large and small perforation holes. We can now add the Diner to that list. Rob Loeffler has found strips of S11111 that have small holes. The large hole variety seems to be more prevalent. Pictures of both types are shown below with the small hole type on top.



Bison Has Manufacturing Numbers

The 21¢ Bison coil has been found to have a nine digit manufacturing impression counter number on the back of some stamps. It appears once every 35 stamps, which is one revolution of Avery's Dia Nippon Kiko gravure press, and is on only one row of the web. With each successive appearance the number increases by one. The nine digits span at least two stamps and are located between 1L and 3L (looking through the face of the stamps). Of what use this number is to Avery or anyone else is unknown. D. John Shultz reported this feature, and the graphic below is courtesy of Jim Fowler.



Buffalo Chips - Times Five

Many of us have wondered why there is a plate number every five stamps on the new Bison coil. Doug Iams asked Avery, and the answer was amazing. "Five is the only common denominator for 35 (one revolution) and 100 (the roll size)." An even fit for plate numbers in a roll has never been a problem for any other printer. Why does it bother Avery? Too many numbers.

Puzzling Situation for FOP Error

Single mint copies of the Porch Flag double die cut error are going begging at auction. Twice a minimum bid of \$45 was asked and there were no bidders. Granted these don't have a plate number, but at that price one should be part of any special FOP collection.

Section 2. Standing Committees

The following permanent committees are established to assure that essential club functions are accomplished in a timely and efficient manner.

a. Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall consist of the three latest available Past Presidents, with the most recent Past President serving as Chairperson. In the event that three Past Presidents are not available to serve, the current President shall appoint as required to fill vacancies. It shall be the duty of the Nominating Committee to canvas the club membership for qualified candidates for the office of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Member-at-Large, as required for election. Any person planning to run for office or member-at-large should not serve on the Nominating Committee.

b. Ballot Committee. To prepare, distribute, tally and certify results of ballots and all elections and membership voting matters.

c. Finance Committee. For the purpose of assuring a continuous sound condition of the treasury, to develop a budget for the operation of the club, and to make recommendations to the Board regarding Club finances. The Treasurer shall be a member of this committee.

d. Publicity and Public Relations Committee. For the purpose of initiating and carrying out all matters pertaining to publicity and public relations and maintaining a positive image of the PNC3 both internally and without.

e. ByLaws Committee. For the purpose of considering and recommending revisions or amendments to the by-laws.

f. Ethics Committee. For the purpose of establishing and maintaining a Code of Ethics for use by the club in conducting its affairs and in guiding the actions of its members; to hear all complaints concerning matters covered by such Code; to investigate complaints referred to the Committee by the President concerning matters covered by the Code of Ethics; and to provide recommendations to the Executive Board as to such complaints.

g. Membership Committee. For the purpose of maintaining and increasing the membership of the club; to investigate and recommend Executive Board disposition of all objections to any applicant's membership in the Club. The Club Secretary shall be a member of this committee.

h. Regional Meetings Committee. For the purpose of carrying out guidelines for Club regional meetings as established by the Executive Board, scheduling and promoting same, and reporting the activities at such meetings to the membership.

i. Publication Advisory Committee. For the purpose of overseeing club publications and making recommendations to the Executive Board regarding such publications.

j. Awards and Exhibits Committee. For the purpose of establishing and distributing awards given by the Club, and to develop ways to encourage the successful exhibition of PNCs.

k. Estate Advisory Committee. For the purpose of advising and/or assisting the estate of any club members regarding plate number coil possessions.

NEW 3/13/01 - We are happy to report that all the Philatelic Links and are now working. Please check the offices you are aware of and let us know about corrections.

NEW 3/11/01 - Another late addition to the 2001 stamp program is a non-denominated (10¢?) Atlas Stamp. This seems to hint that a "monuments" series (or mini-series) is under way, as this would be a companion to the "Literary Lions" stamp issued last November. No issue date or city has yet been determined.

NEW 3/08/01 - New number reported for the denominated flowers. Add B2111 to your checklists.

■ 3/04/01 - More Philatelic offices listings were updated today, including Colorado, DC, Delaware, Hawaii, Idaho and Iowa.

■ 3/03/01 - Among late additions to the 2001 stamp program is a non-denominated (15¢) "Woody Wagon" in the American Culture Series, to be issued August third in Denver. (A Woody Wagon, for those who don't remember, was a wood-paneled station wagon popular with surfers in the 50s and 60s. Grab an old "Beach" movie from the era and you'll likely find a Woody Wagon as an uncredited cast member).

■ 3/01/01 - The 21c Bison coil has been found with two different die-cut configurations. The stamp is known with PV (Peak/Valley) and VP (Valley/Peak) die cuts. The first cut on the top left can be either a peak or a valley. A 300dpi scan is included to the right. If you click on it, a much larger copy of the same scan will open up in a new window so you can see better detail of the differences. PV is at top, and VP is at bottom.

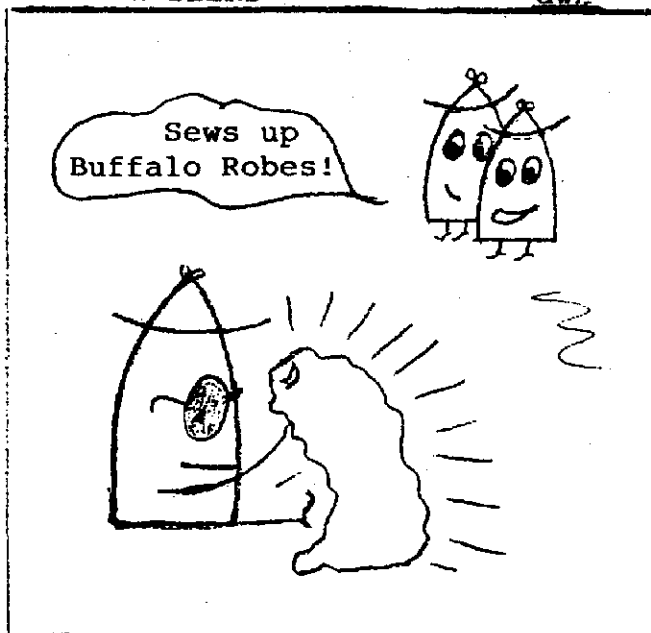
