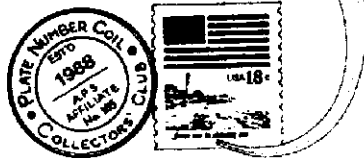

A 29c Mount Rushmore strip of seven No.6 with Lenz tagging, graded XF, is among the 445 lots in the 34th auction of the Plate Number Coil Collectors Club.

Auctioneer Joe Sedivy has set March 18 as the deadline for bids to be in hands. A bid sheet is attached to the back of this issue. Bids may also be submitted via email. All instructions are on the bid sheet.

The auction is heavy on strips of five.

Among other items noted in the auction: (The editor has no items in the auction or knowledge of the owners):

- \* Scott 1895 #4, PS5 for a minimum bid of \$445.
- \* Scott 1900 #3 PS5 for minimum bid of \$195 and a #5 for a minimum bid of \$170.
- \* Scott 1903a PS5 #8 gap, 1-7/8L, possible new find as there is a second gap in top line only at 1/8L for a minimum bid of \$205.
- \* Scott 1908 PS5, #7 for a minimum bid of \$145.
- \* Scott 1891 #6 several examples used with faults.

Also the latest publication date for the catalog page associated with each PNC ID is shown so you can know if you have the latest printing of a catalog page. The second list is in order by Scott number. If you know the Scott number, you can find the name and corresponding PNC ID. The last list is the Name Index in alphabetical order by the name of the issue. If you know the name of a coil stamp, you can find the corresponding PNC ID. These PNC ID lists are reprinted annually with the new issues of the preceding year.

### **AP Non-Denominated Liberty Flag**

Al Haake has reported finding P1111 on the non-denominated (39c) Liberty Flag. Previously only P2222 was known.

Rolls of the P2222 have turned up in the St. Louis area with the die cutting shifted to near the middles of the stamps. A roll sold on ebay for \$143.

### **39c Denominated Coils**

The 39c Liberty Flag in rolls of 3K were recently released, and as expected, the plate number is V1111 like it was on the rolls of 10K. Several back number positions have been reported on these large rolls, but so far the only reported position within a PS5 is position 5 (2R).

#### **Get ready for a flood of new coils in March and April:**

24c Common Buckeye Butterfly PSA coil of 100 from Avery with plate # interval 11  
39c Liberty Flag WAG coils of 100, 3K and 10K from Sennett with plate # interval 14

39c Crops of the Americas (5 designs) PSA coil of 100 from Sennett with plate # interval 25

April 8

39c Liberty Flag PSA coils of 100 (from ?)

Do not be at all surprised if not all of these coils are not available in your area on their issue dates as local release is often delayed until supplies of the non-denominated stamps are used up.

### **Egret V3221**

Two small finds of the 37c Egret V3221 have been reported. The finders wish to remain anonymous.

### **Eagle S3333333 without Black Line**

In the October issue of Coil Line I reported that part of the S3333333 production did not carry the vertical black line on the back of the liner. Mint rolls have now been located.

Sennett's SA Lion S55555 was printed with a different size cylinder than previous plate numbers. Consequently the plate number interval changed from 21 to 20. S55555 & higher have the 20 interval.

Ashton Potter's SA Seacoast P2222 was die cut with two different mats. One is serpentine cut on all four sides while the other has serpentine cuts on the sides and straight cuts on top and bottom.

● In printing the SA Seacoast with cylinders P2222 through P7777 AP changed the cylinder size from that used to print P1111. Thus the plate number intervals changed from 22 to 27. P3333 through P7777 have a small date and color order of BCMY.

■ The Kestrels differ in the order of color laydown. Colors are black, yellow, cyan and magenta, Type I sequence is BYCM. Type II is BCMY. Type III is YMCB. The color order shows in the plate number.

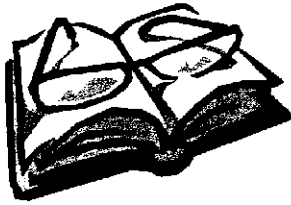
Andy Jakes:

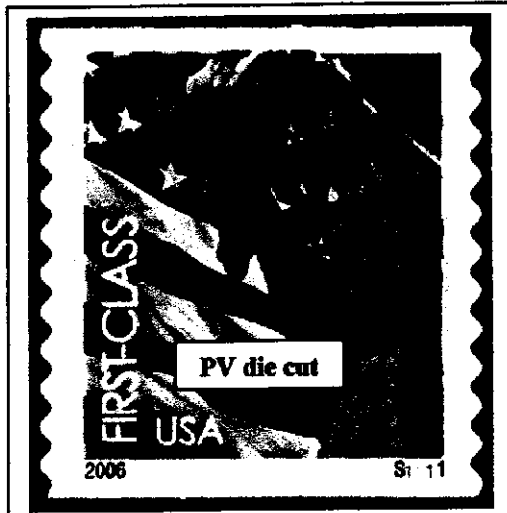

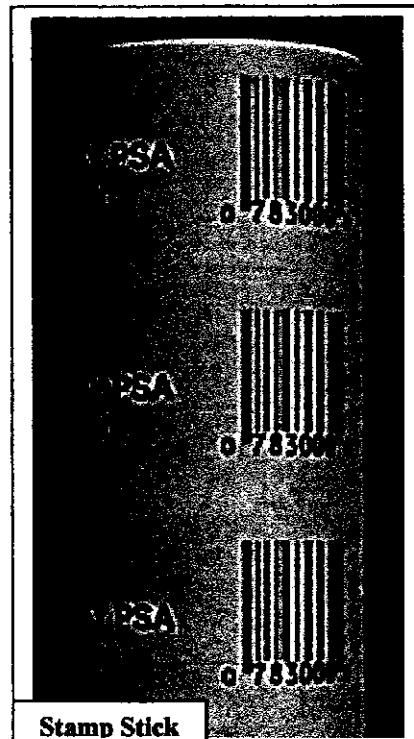
The Sennett Security Products (SSP) self-adhesive nondenominated Lady Liberty and U. S. Flag is the second of three self-adhesive rolls of 100 issued on December 8, 2005. It pays the 39 cent first class rate that went into effect January 8, 2006.

The S1111 plate number appears every 14 stamps along the roll. There is a black 2006 date in the lower left corner of every stamp.

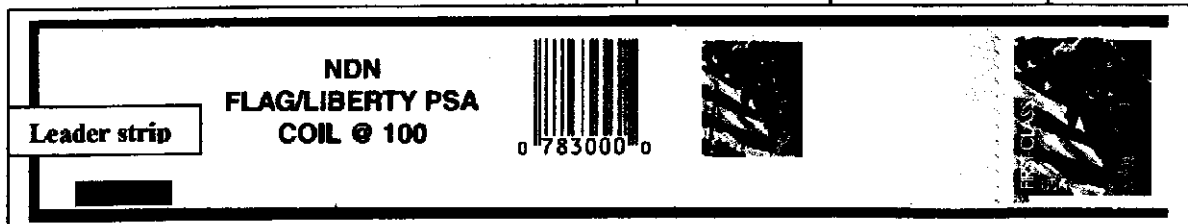
These coils are packaged in a stick format with one coil stacked on another, 10 coils high. Tiny pieces of uncut paper known as bridges hold the stack together until it is separated. A leader strip, the height of the coil with adhesive on the ends, wraps the coil into a neat package.



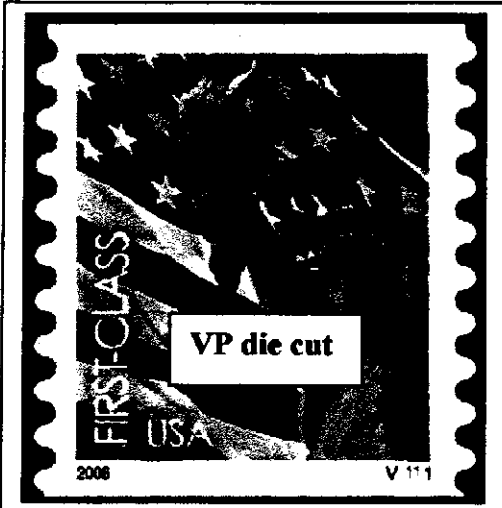

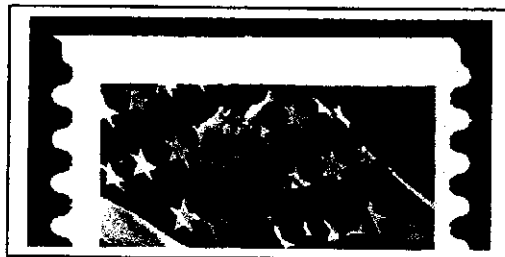
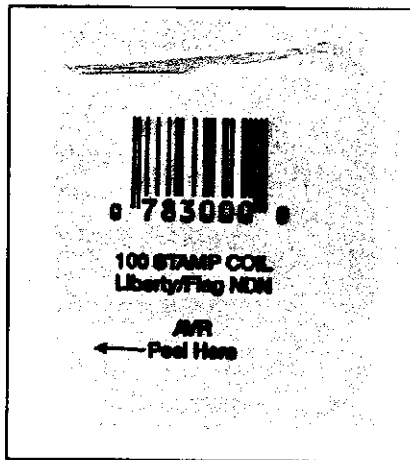


The Avery Dennison (AVR) self-adhesive nondenominated Lady Liberty and U. S. Flag was the first of three self-adhesive rolls of 100 issued on December 8, 2005. It pays the 39 cent first class rate that went into effect January 8, 2006.

The V1111 plate number appears every 11 stamps along the roll. There is a black 2006 date in the lower left corner of every stamp.

The common VP die cut is shown to the left and the less common PV below it. The bottom die cut varieties (Knoll Bottom, Bell Bottom, Thimble Bottom) were illustrated in the January 2006 Coil Line. Shown at the bottom of the page is a Bell Top shifted die cut.

This is the only version of the SA roll of 100 that comes in a bubble pack. An image of the bubble pack label is shown below.

## Reporting the Rarities

As last year drew to a close, another example of one of the rarest of PNCs surfaced, a Flag Over Porch #66666 with 12/11 die. It is, unfortunately, damaged but as one of six known copies, is certainly a wonderful find.

Other finds made late last year include two used copies of the elusive Green Bike #333 round shoulder die. A third additional find was reported in mid-February, as well as one mint. A review of the report history of this stamp revealed that I failed to include an earlier report in the used count, so the total of used copies increases by four, bringing the total of known used singles to six. The count on mint PS/5s is now two.

Also reported were two copies of the (5¢) Mountain (Avery) #V333342 with the rare 13/12 die cut, and one copy of the #V333343 with the round shoulder die. The normal cut on the #V333342 is 12/13, but all other Avery Mountains have the 13/12 die. This brings the total on this rare die to 19 used and 3 on cover. The count on used copies of the V333342 round shoulder is now four, with no reports of mint or on cover. Keep looking, there are more out there.

In addition, three more examples of Diner #22211 round shoulder die have surfaced, bringing that count to 60 used and 7 on cover. At 60 used copies, this is one of the most common varieties on this list, the other being the FOP 78777 10/10 die (64). Arguably, these two stamps may be candidates for replacement at some future date, especially if ongoing searches for the (presumably) rare Egret numbers don't get any results. Would members rather I add to the list, or replace the varieties with higher counts? Send a note or e-mail (address below) with your preference.

# Incision Styles on Snowy Egrets

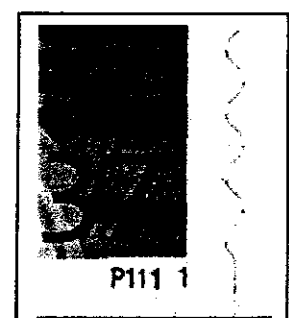

The 37c Snowy Egret produced by Ashton Potter has been found to date with plate numbers P11111, P22222, P33333, P44444, and P55555. At least the first two of these have been produced with two different incision styles of the cutting die that imparts the separations to these self-adhesive stamps.

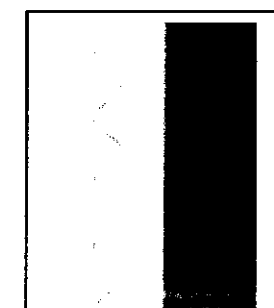
When I first noticed the difference, it appeared to me that the shape of the incision on the P11111 resembled a series of triangles instead of the usual serpentine shape. Upon closer inspection, I determined that the shape was, indeed, serpentine. The feature that made it look triangular was, instead, a paper tie (or bridge) located at the tip of the peak and bottom of the valley.

The serpentine shaped die cut on these Ashton Potter Egrets is quite different than that of the serpentine shape on the Avery Dennison Egret counterparts. Avery Dennison uses a die shape that is quite rounded at the peak and valley. The Ashton Potter die has a much shorter turning radius at the tip and bottom. Consequently the nearly straight part of the shape is positioned at more of a slant than the Avery Dennison version.

The enlargements below show the differences between the Ashton Potter styles and a comparison between them and the Avery Dennison style typical of their die shape. I call the first Ashton Potter style shown 'multiple ties' and the second 'single tie'. On the examples I've seen the multiple tie style has a tie at each top and bottom of the peaks and valleys. The single tie version apparently has only one tie (randomly spaced) along the entire length of the stamp's edge.

The Ashton Potter multiple tie variety has been noted on plates P11111 and P22222 thus far. It is possible that the die cutting mat having multiple ties was retired during production of P22222 and was not used for P33333 and subsequent numbers. If someone has an example of the multiple tie variety used on P33333 or higher, please let me know.

Multiple incision style varieties have been noted in the past on many issues, particularly at the earlier periods of production of self-adhesive 32c Flag Over Porch (FOP) issues. There were four distinct incision styles used to produce FOPs at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, and these same styles appear on other issues printed by the BEP in the same era, such as the Yellow Rose.

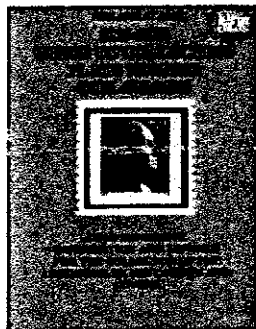
