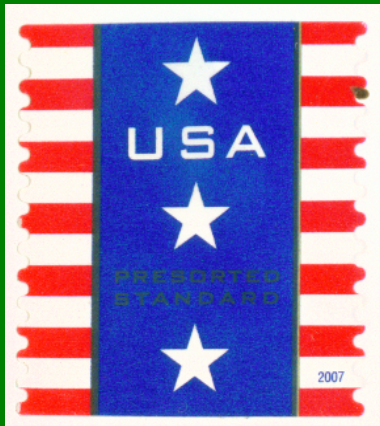

2010 Dues are Now Past Due

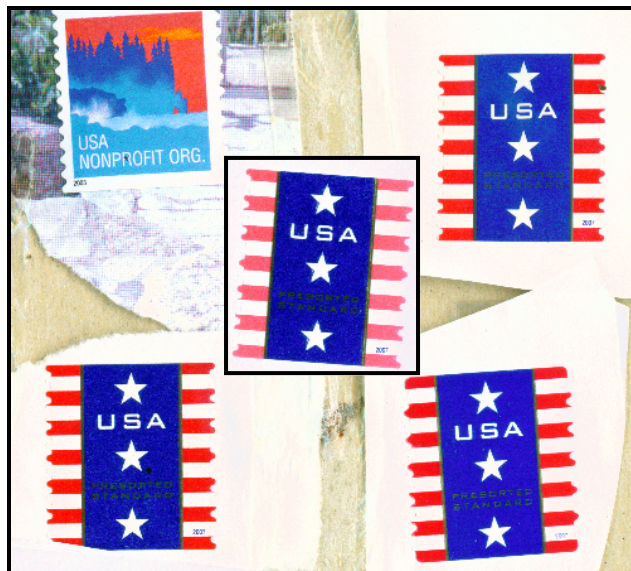

Sunlight Test Progress

by Ron Blanks



Here's an update to the "pink" (10¢) Banner story in last month's issue. I began a sunlight-exposure test on some coils that used reddish inks in their designs. The goal is to see how long it might take for direct sunlight to cause fading, and specifically if red-ink fading might approximate the "pinkish" color reported for some (10¢) Banner (Sennett-supplied) coils found on-cover. The scan above was made on January 14 and reflects about 215 hours of exposure, and shows no fading. (The center stamp is one of the "pink" stamps, superimposed on the exposure set. See it on the front cover in color with the upper-right test coil.)

Readers' Forum

I enjoyed the reading and factual tidbits in *Coil Line* in regard to the problems of soaking self-adhesive stamps. I would like to call attention to the use of naphtha only to correct the spelling to **naphtha**, without being overbearing.

Thanks for bringing this to our attention. Almost everyone missed this, it seems, including the “spell checker” on the laptop computer. By the time this appears in print, I hope to have mastered the “resetting” of a document’s spell-checking. At present, I haven’t figured out how this slipped by but I can report the software dictionary contains “naphtha” but not the incorrect “naptha” we used extensively in the recent issues. I must have absent-mindedly “added” the wrong spelling during checking, and it likely wound up in a “custom” dictionary I need to update. – Editor

I was intrigued by the phosphor-tagging variety inquiry in the December *Coil Line* [regarding large-roll 37¢ Flag coils dated 2004 (PNC #S1111)]. I checked my reference material and noted the following:

(1) Scott #3632Cd* under shortwave ultraviolet light (SW-UV) – noted a smoother, less blotchy appearing mottled tagging. These same stamps showed reddish-orange stripes under longwave UV light (LW-UV).

(2) #3632Cd* under LW-UV – noted three consistent paper types in my 100-stamp sampling. I know that soaking can affect the appearance under LW-UV; however, these three are too numerous to be stains, etc.

(3) #3632C SW- & LW-UV – in a smaller sampling of only 25 copies, I found nothing of any significant difference.

[* – Effective 2010, Scott de-listed this number.]

I also checked all copies for any afterglow (phosphorescence) and found none.

These are not actual phosphor-tagging varieties; however, I found them noteworthy for my collection. I am looking forward to my next issue of *Coil Line* to see what I should be looking for. – Richard Cole #2094



Editor’s reply: These self-adhesive large-roll coils were supplied by Sennett Security Products (SSP) for use in lettershop affixing machines; they come spaced apart on liner paper (the mint pair above is still on liner). This allows affixers to easily “tip” coils onto envelopes as part of assembling large mailings. Only plate number S1111 was used (two used PNCs are shown below in normal light).

However, two types of the prephosphored coated paper were found. One appears with a “smooth” glow under SW-UV, that the 2009 Scott specialized catalog assigned #3632C. The other type appears with an “uneven” glow (showing marbled dark streaks) that Scott assigned #3632Cd. Effective with the 2010 specialized edition, Scott no longer numbers these two distinctions for prephosphored coated paper types; “3632Cd” is no more.



I recently reviewed my cache of non-PNC examples of this coil, still on-piece culled from many 37¢-era clippings mixtures. I also noticed, as Richard did, some of the uneven-tagged type showing only faint marbling of absent-taggant streaks in the paper. Some were so faint that I can see these coils easily being confused as the smooth-tagged type, especially on paper that also fluoresces brightly under SW-UV, (please see next page)

Editor's Message

FROM THE EDITOR . . .

The color examples of the “pink” (10¢) Banner items on the *printed* cover of last month's issue didn't quite turn out as well as I hoped. Then I considered the “tan” background we used on the cover and had an idea. (I'm not sure why the printed tan seems so strong; I think it should be toned down, so we'll see what happens on the new cover.) The idea concerns the use of a suitable background color when trying to examine items of a related color. There are actual “complimentary” colors that, used as background, enable given colors to be viewed best.

For example, “reds” are best viewed against a green background. So for this issue's cover, I've redone the color patches related to the “pink” (10¢) Banners (Sennett-supplied) that were first discussed last month. I have office supply filing folders in various colors that I use for background when viewing stamp color shades. For what it's worth, here are the backgrounds I use: a strong yellow for viewing violet-related colors; orange for viewing blue-related; red for viewing green-related, and gray for everything else. (I have also read that brown is

a good general-purpose background color, too).

(from page 21) obscuring the faint dark blotches.

About the afterglow on this issue, I can see how Richard might conclude there isn't any, when in fact there is. When one looks at a group of coils including some Transportation series from the 1980s under SW-UV, interesting things happen when you shut off the UV lamp. Older stamps, mostly with overall tagging or tagging blocks applied on top of the design, often show an obvious afterglow that can last for seconds.

Yet recent coils on prephosphored paper that glow seem to “go dark” immediately when the lamp is off. Yet I can attest these stamps will also show an afterglow under the right conditions. Without belaboring the point, I had to use a completely dark room, and I held my four-watt SW-UV several seconds over some of the 37¢ coils to see a brief afterglow after turning the lamp off.

See my article on page 27 for news that prompted my research inquiry into these 37¢ coils.

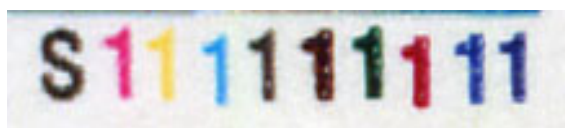
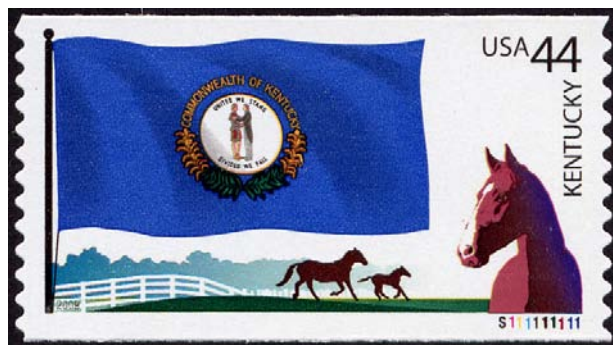

Catalog Corner

**44¢ Flags of Our Nation
Series Three (SSP) (SA)
Plate S11111111
PNC ID 2009-8**

The Third Series of self-adhesive (SA) 44¢ Flags of Our Nation stamps from Sennett Security Products (SSP) went on sale August 6, 2009 at the APS Stampshow in Pittsburgh, PA.

The S11111111 plate number in the lower right-hand corner repeats every 10 stamps along the roll (on every Kentucky stamp).

Like the first two Flags of Our Nation series issued in 2008, these are rolls of 50. New this time is the black mark on every leader strip, and the clear tape after the leader strip (before the first stamp).

The first stamp on the roll is the Kentucky Flag (*shown here at left*). This flag is followed by other states in alphabetical order as shown below. The last stamp before the designs repeat is an American Flag over a wheat field. All stamps have a peak/valley (PV) die cut pattern.

A leader strip identifies and seals the roll. An example of the leader strip is shown at the bottom of this page.



“Bell Bottom to Peak/Valley”

This is the first of a series of articles on the Dramatic Die Cut Shifts found on the 44¢ Star Flag (2009-7) and the 28¢ Polar Bear (2009-2), both from Avery Dennison. All rolls of either issue I have examined so far come with a dramatic die cut shift *every 25 stamps* along the roll. Sometimes these shifts occur within a plate strip of five (PS5) with a plate number, but most often they do not. The shift covered in this article is the shift **from** a peak/valley’s (PV’s) misaligned die cut with a **bell bottom, to a normal PV** die cut. Bells on both issues are found in lower-left or upper-right corners. Information in these articles will be incorporated into the revised Avery Dennison Die Cut Varieties publication to be offered in March or April 2010.



Bell Bottom-Left Die Cut



Peak/Valley Die Cut

To understand the die cutting shift that occurs every 25 stamps along the Avery Dennison coils, one must know what an **unshifted** version of each variety looks like. Above at left is a misaligned “bell bottom-left” die cut as it normally appears. Note the bell shape in the lower-left corner and half peak at the top-left corner of the stamp. Also, the bottom-right corner has a rounded rather than a square corner cut.

Above at right is a normal Peak/Valley die cut. It has a full peak in the upper-left corner and a square corner in the lower-right corner. The lower-left corner and the upper-right corner both show valleys.

Bell Bottom-Left to PV (slight bell)

Peak/Valley Die Cut

(Higher contrast was applied to this image to strengthen the die cut view at lower left.)



Bell Bottom-Left to PV (typical bell)

In the mint coil pair above, the stamp on the left shows a slight bell in the lower-left corner, while the stamp to the right is a normal PV stamp. The dramatic die cut shift from a bell bottom to a PV occurred with the leftmost stamp.

The single stamp at left is a better example of the Bell Bottom to PV die cut shift. It has a well-defined bell in the lower-left corner, but the bottom-right corner has the normal, square die-cut characteristic of the PV die cut. (See the 44¢ Star Flags on previous page to view what an unshifted bell at-bottom variant and a normal PV should look like.)

Used-single and cover collectors should have fun finding these dramatic die cut shifts. The chart on the previous page lists the types of these dramatic shifts found among Avery-supplied rolls of 100 currently on sale in U.S. post offices. Many of the names should be self-evident; future articles will illustrate more types.

Untagged 37¢ Flag Found

by Ron Blanks



Five years after issuance, a used single of the Sennett-supplied 37¢ Flag affixer coil (2004 date) has turned up *without a trace of phosphor tagging*. As explained earlier in Readers' Forum (page 21), this issue was printed using prephosphored paper. As genuine, an untagged example like the discovery copy (*above, at right*) could have resulted from either an untreated portion of paper when the phosphor compound was applied during paper manufacture, or from a portion of plain paper inadvertently used for this issue. I sent a normal PNC and this plain coil to PNC³ member Roland Austin for review, who made this photo under SW-UV. Readers should revisit all coils of this issue to see if any more untagged ones exist.
