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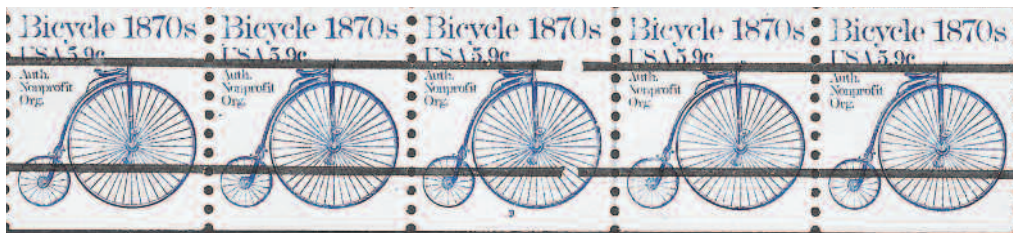

We held our annual board meeting this year at the Richmond show. The full board was either present or represented by proxy. Items discussed included the financial state of the club and it was decided that there will be a \$2 reduction to the membership dues for next year. Another item that was discussed was the elections being held next year. The second was that "he has never found a counterfeit stamp that was tagged." That has been a question that I have had and now it has been answered. The third was "don't automatically assume that if you purchased your stamps at the post office, they are real." Apparently, that has not always been the case.

Less than a week later, I found a new counterfeit stamp called "Love Skywriting" that was purchased from



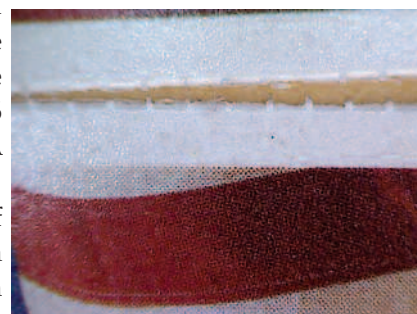

Back Numbers on the Flowers From The Garden Issue

Collecting the different back number combinations on the "Flowers from the Garden" issue will be a challenge



4-digit bottom back number 2980 from a 3K roll.



5-digit top back number 06030 from a 10K roll.

for PNC collectors. There are tiny back numbers every 10 stamps on the back of the liner. These black back numbers can either be at the top or the bottom of the liner.

The 3K rolls have 4-digit back numbers and the 10K rolls have 5-digit back numbers. Because the plate number interval is every 28 stamps (an even number), any individual 3K or 10K roll will either be an even roll or an odd roll.

On an even roll, every 140 stamps the plate number and the back number will fall on the same stamp. On an odd roll, the closest the back number will get to the plate number is one right or one left of the plate numbered stamp. The odd rolls are the only rolls where bookend strips can be found. A bookend strip is a strip of 11 with a back number on each end of the strip and a plate number on the center stamp.

There are four different 3K rolls and four additional 10K rolls necessary to collect all the different back number combinations. Examples of the 5-digit back numbers from a 10K roll and 4-digit 3K roll are shown. To make finding back number positions a little easier, USPS is offering uncut strips of 500 from both the 3K and 10K rolls. The ordering item numbers for these boxes of 500 are shown on the Catalog Corner page in this issue of **Coil Line**. There is no guarantee which of the four possible combinations you will get when you order the boxes of 500 and it is my understanding these boxes cannot be returned for credit. New issue dealers will no doubt seek out all combinations for their customers.

There is no price shown on the 3K label, but both the 3K and 10K labels show a copyright date of 2016.

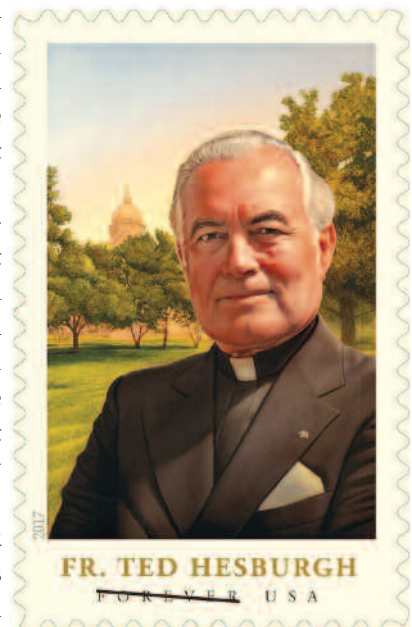
A 2017 date is printed in the bottom left corner on the outside of the design on each stamp.



USPS Issues New Coil

The United States Postal Service issued a new "Forever" stamp on September 1 in Notre Dame, Indiana. The 49¢ stamp, created in both panes of 20 and PSA coils of 50 (Item 799400) were available nationwide on the first day of issue.

Stamp Fulfillment Services did not make an automatic push to post offices. Coils can only be obtained through the Post Office Store website at usps.com/shop or by calling 1-800-782-6724. According to Frank Covey, only 40,000 coils are available as this is a planned rarity.



First day covers featuring the coil stamp (Item 799416) and covers with a digital color postmark (799421) can also be purchased.

The Reverend Father Theodore M. Hesburgh, C.S.C. (1917-2015) is considered one of the most important educational, religious and civic leaders of the 20th century. The stamp features an oil-on-panel painting of Father Hesburgh standing on the campus of the University of Notre Dame, where he served as president for 35 years.

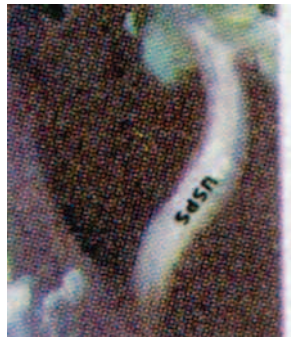

USPS Microprinting on the Flowers from the Garden Issue

USPS is microprinted at a different location on each stamp on the Flowers from the Garden Issue.



On the stamp with the red flowers and yellow vase, USPS microprinting is just above "USA FOREVER." On the stamp with the white and pink flowers, USPS is on the bottom flower, just left of the word "FOREVER."

On the plate numbered stamp with the blue flowers and pot, USPS is left of the flower stem in the upper right corner of the stamp. On the stamp with the white flowers and white pot, USPS is microprinted in the handle of the white pot.

Microprinting is a security device used to help prevent counterfeiting.

Beyond the Numbers

When is a PNC also a PMC?

A discussion of the stamps of the 1980s would be incomplete without mentioning purple machine cancels (PMCs). Check out the "Reference" tab on the pnc3.org website and you will see an entire section dedicated to Purple Machine Cancels. So, what's so special about purple machine cancels?

Like any collectible, it's partly a question of scarcity. Purple ink was used experimentally in the early 1970s when the existing black ink was found to jam the canceling machines. Purple ink was used operationally in 146 cities between 1980-1984, with a "heyday" period of 1981-1983. But the purple ink was hard to read and, when the stamps were soaked, ran and discolored the stamps, causing grief among collectors. Perhaps more important from the perspective of the U.S. Postal Service, the cancel could be washed off and the stamps reused. The purple ink was phased out when a new black ink was developed in 1982.

Because of the limited time period during which purple ink was used, the ratio of black-to-purple machine cancels from that period is estimated at about 10 to 1 (February 1992 PNC³ *Coil Line*), thus the relative scarcity.

Purple machine cancels offer a variety of ways to "structure" a specialized collection. As a PNC collector venturing beyond the numbers, I might start a PMC-on-PNC collection by trying to find all the known purple machine-canceled PNCs, using the handy table in the aforementioned "Reference" tab. In the process, perhaps I might even be lucky enough to discover a previously unidentified example!

But it seems that such a search could take quite a long time. After I wrote this article, but before I submitted it, the July 2017 *Coil Line* included not one but three articles on purple machine cancels: Dan Forgues and John Himes both reported successful finds after many years of searching for specific PMCs on PNCs. Thus discouraged, I might instead look for any type of PMC (not just those on PNCs) from as many as I could find of the 146 cities in which the purple ink was used. Or, I could search for and organize PMCs by date, hoping to discover an earlier earliest known use (EKU), or a later latest known use (LKU) than those reported on the pnc3.org website, which cites an EKU of April 29, 1972, and an LKU of July 8, 1998.

Are there purple machine cancels lurking in your

collection? Have a look, but beware! If they are still on cover (on their envelope) or on a paper cutting, do not soak them. The ink is likely to run, ruining the cancel and probably also discoloring the stamp.

If you do decide to venture beyond your own collection in search of PMCs, it would be wise to do some research beforehand. Due to their relative scarcity, PNCs with purple machine cancels, especially on cover, can command hundreds of dollars each. And, as noted in the Q&A of the January 2012 *Coil Line*, just because the ink is purple does not qualify it as a purple machine cancel. A common reddish-maroon ink can fade during soaking, making it appear purplish. To help guide you, there are many excellent articles and checklists on the topic of PMCs in the pnc3.org archive, and a relatively recent (2000) book by Robert M. Washburn titled *PMCs: A Guide to Collecting Purple Machine Cancels*.

Sorting a 4.5 Pound PNC Used Mixture: An Update

The sorting of the 4.5 pound used PNC mixture that was shown in the September **Coil Line** is proceeding nicely. The first round of sorting took 14,000 stamps out of the mix leaving 24,000 stamps for the second round.

Sorted out of the first round were 11 issues, all transporations; junk was thrown out and all pairs and strips.

The issues sorted out in the second round are the "D," "E," "H," 23¢ Washington, 32¢ Yellow Rose, 34¢ Liberty, Honeybee, 33¢ Berries, (10¢) E&S, Consumer Ed, 34¢ Flower, Lion and American Eagle. This is 13 more issues sorted and a few more damaged stamps discarded. This second sorting took out 15,000 stamps leaving 9,000 for the third sorting. See the pictures of the second sorting showing the 13 piles of issues and the sealable bags they went into. The shoe box lid shows the 9,000 left for the next round.



Sorted in the third round round were the Green Bike, Mountain, Diner, 33¢ Flag, Juke Box, Bison, Wetlands, Seacoast, Butte and Flags of our Nation.

These 10 issues took out 5,900 stamps leaving 3,100

for the next sorting. The picture of the third sorting shows the 10 piles of stamps and the sealable bags.

The shoe box lid shows the 3,100 stamps for the next sorting round.



The fourth sorting round separated out the Pheasant, "F," Toleware, Banner, 34¢ Statue of Liberty, 26¢ Panther, Snowman, 23¢ USA, Tiffany Lamp, Sunflower and Beautiful Bloom. These 11 issues took out 2,400 stamps leaving 700 for the final sorting. The picture of the fourth sorting shows the 11 piles of stamps and the sealable bags. The shoe box lid is almost empty with only 700 stamps for the fifth and final issue sorting.

The fifth and final sorting targeted the Antique Toys, Coffeepot, Butterfly, Uncle Sam, Automobile, Blue Jay, Woody Wagon, Big Horn Sheep, Washington Monument, Clock, Chair, Kestrel, 23¢ Flag, Tail Fin, Row Boat, Polar Bear, Tropical Fruit, 3¢ Star, Woodpecker, Weather Vane, Envelope and a few miscellaneous. This last sorting was for 21 issues



plus a few miscellaneous. See picture showing this last sorting. These were put into glassines.

Total issues sorted were 67 plus the Transportations. I will update in a future **Coil Line** what was found when I sort out the different plate numbers.

Remember that the material in this 38,000-stamp lot was from other PNC collectors' extras.

Getting a Little Assistance

No one who hunted for plate numbers on coils could be successful without help from others along the way. The philatelic clerks were the ones I found helpful in the beginning, but they did not have many items. I knew the Kansas City Philatelic Center probably had some of those numbers I needed, but I had no contacts there. Things would change.

Through my contact with a non-profit organization I came to know George Godin. George did some stamp work for them and was a big collector with contacts among people who knew how to get material from Kansas City. George was big with the Bureau Issues Association (BIA). He kept track of plate numbers for them, so his work sort of fit in to what I was doing.

One of George's contacts was Sam Golman of St. Louis, who had connections with Kansas City. Sam was also a PNC collector. I would help Sam with his collection and he would send my want list to Ray Arrington at KC to see what I could get. I remember one purchase of 100 rolls of 500 of 5.2¢ mint 3, 5 and 50 rolls of 9.3¢ 5, 6. They could help with non pre-cancel stamps much more than the pre-cancels.

One of the really tough sets of numbers then was 5.2¢PC 4, 6. I tried all my contacts then and was unsuccessful. My contact at the non-profit organization had an idea. He would go to the postal service and offer to buy \$1,000,000 face of 5.2¢PC rolls if they were plate numbers 4, 6. Jim Smith from Washington, D.C. contacted him and we got rolls of 3,000 from Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

My problem then again was how many to buy. I stripped many rolls. Many were in strips of 4 as PS5 was not a standardized size then. Like so many items I bought, the market was far larger than I assumed. I ran out and the numbers remained a premium. They would command many times their current price if it were not for another find years later.

Edith Diane Thompson struck gold in Mt. Prospect, Illinois, on rolls of 500. Diane, as she likes to be called, was one of the premier hunters in the U.S. Her clever techniques landed her many valuable finds over the years. Even today she has the largest holding of PN's in the country.

Look for more on her story and others entering the search as "The Hunt Intensifies" next time.

Error Corner

This month I'm talking about the 9.3¢ precancel Mail Wagon imperf (Scott #1903b). It exists with plate numbers #1, 2, 3 and 4. *Datz's Catalogue of Errors* values the #1 and #2 at \$1,250 each.

As you will see, it is important to know something about the Cottrell press and gap positions. A quick lesson is



that there are two different repeating plate numbers per roll on the Cottrell. Each plate number has a vertical line to the right of the plate number and a gap in the precancel lines every 12 stamps. The position of the gap on the #3 and 4 imperf stamps is 5½ stamps to the right of the Cottrell line.

This is key because the strip of 54 I have has a clear #3 but the precancel line obscures the #4. The precancel bars drop down far enough to cover the plate #4 or possibly the roll is from the top of the web and is miscut such that there is no number. Therefore, the only way to prove this should be a #4 is to keep this long strip together. The #3 is on one end and it must be a #4 next to the Cottrell line on the other end.

I saved a matching long perforated #3/4 strip with the same 5½ gap for proof it exists. The only pieces with the #3 and #4 numbers showing are the pictured mangled #4 and the #3 on my long strip. Ken Lawrence wrote an article for *Linn's* about how even the ugly #4 could be considered a treasure.

The <49¢> Flowers from the Garden First-Class Forever coils of 3,000 and 10,000 went on sale August 16, 2017 in Sioux Falls, SD 57104. They were also available nationwide on the same date.

These self-adhesive stamps are mounted on a liner that is taller than the stamp and there are spaces between the stamps on the liner.

There are four designs in this issue. Each design depicts flowers arranged in a pot, modeled after original art work done by Elizabeth Brandon. The four designs are shown on this page. Each bunch is artfully arranged in a container.

One stamp highlights red camellias and yellow forsythia in a yellow pitcher. Another features white peonies and pink tree peonies in a clear vase. A third stamp shows an arrangement of blue hydrangea in a blue pot while the last displays white hydrangea, white and pink roses, green hypericum berries and purple lisianthus in a white vase.

Banknote Corporation of America produced this issue. There is a B1111 plate number every 28th stamp along both the 3K and 10K coils. Most collectors will collect this as a plate strip of 9 with the plate numbered stamp in the middle of the strip.

The B1111 plate number is on the stamp with the blue flowers in a blue pot as shown on this page. The offset printing was done on phosphor tagged paper.
