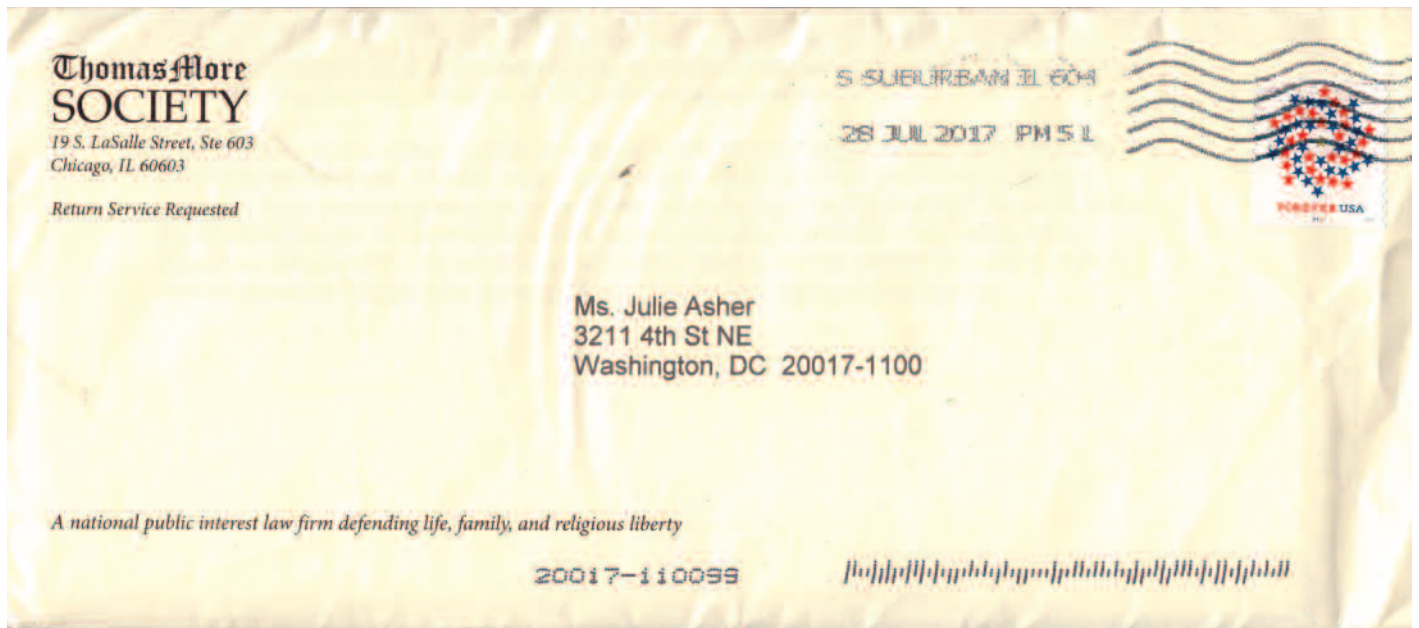

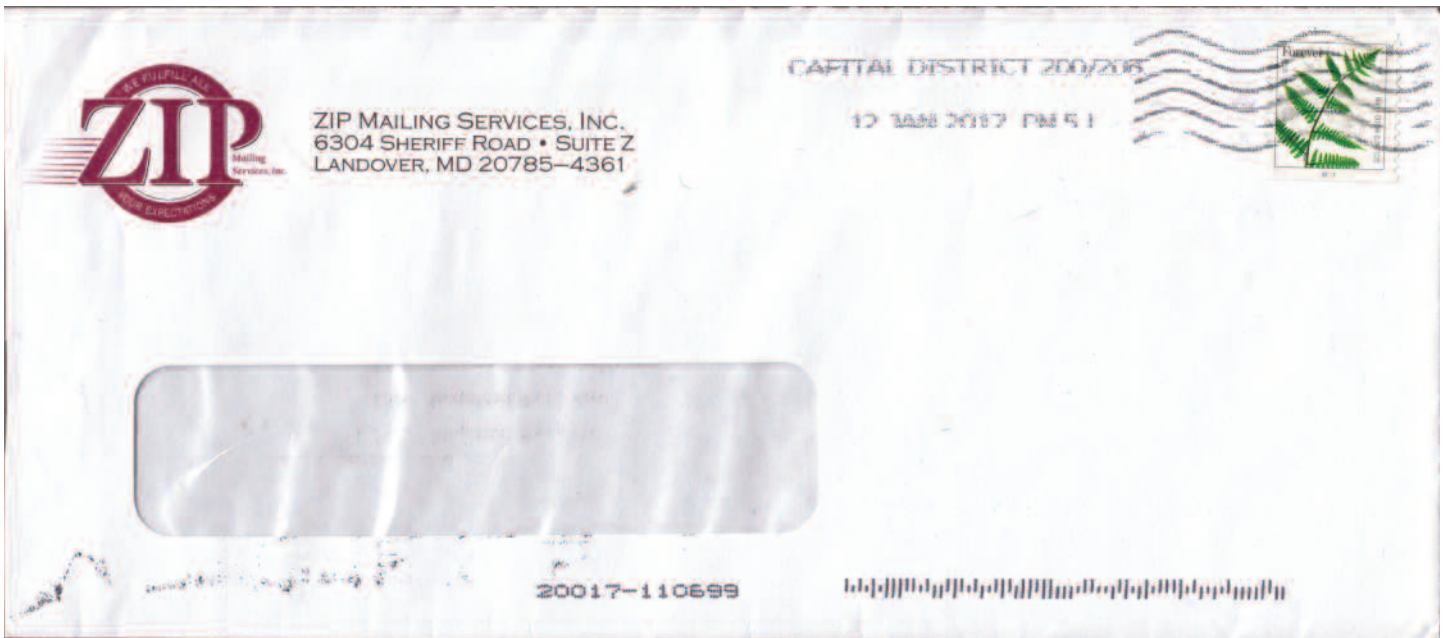

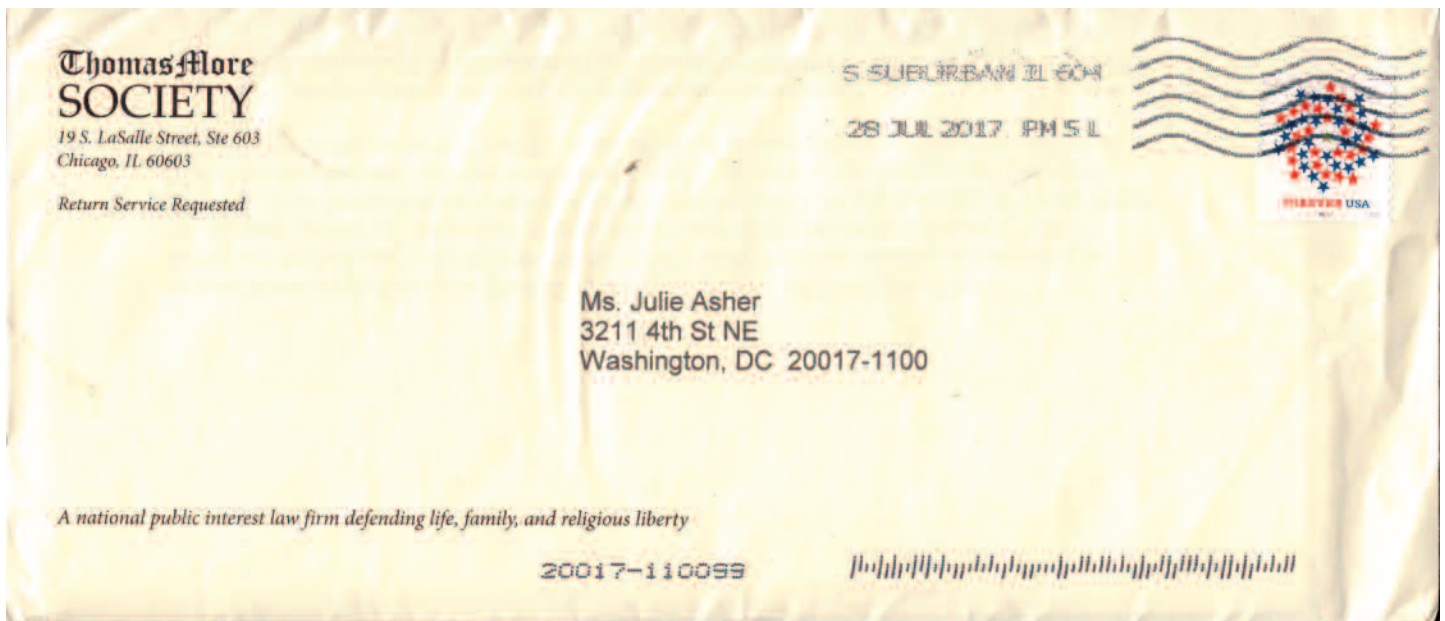
47¢ and 49¢ PNCs

On January 26, 2014, the first class one-ounce letter rate increased from 46¢ to 49¢. It stayed 49¢ until April 9, 2016 when the first class one-ounce letter rate was surprisingly reduced to 47¢, only to increase again nine months later back to 49¢ on January 22, 2017. The second 49¢ first class rate ended on January 20, 2018 when the rate increased to the current 50¢ rate. (Since January 26, 2014, first class let-

ters using meters could be sent at a discount from the rates mentioned.)

Here is a preliminary view of earliest usage dates on covers going through the U.S. mailstream for the 49¢ and 47¢ PNC issues (all coils are listed according to denomination when issued):

This column was to be on embedded tagging varieties. I could not find any, even after asking a few club members if they knew of any varieties. Please let me know if you are aware of any and I will do a follow-up column.

This month I will move ahead and talk about surface tagging varieties. Surface tagging usually appears smooth (solid) but can also be uneven depending if the tagging was sprayed on or rolled on. The image shows 4140 17¢ Big Horn Sheep #S11111111 and what the two varieties look like.



Here is a list of surface tagged issues that have both smooth and uneven appearance.

- 4140 17¢ Big Horn Sheep #S11111111
- 4141 26¢ Florida Panther #S1111
- 4187 41¢ Flag on Pole #S1111

Another is the 37¢ Flag. This issue has been given Scott number 3632A for the smooth variety and 3632Ae for the uneven variety. Plate numbers S1111 and S2222 have smooth only and S3333 and S4444 have both smooth or uneven.

Two stamps that are in the area of surface tagging varieties are the 2257d 10¢ Canal Boat #4 and the 2529b 19¢ Fishing Boat #A5555. Both are untagged and both have the normal stamp surface tagged. Yes, they both lack tagging but I personally don't see them as untagged errors. I see them as being printed on the wrong paper.

This will be my last monthly writing of "When The Lights Go Out." I will try to write future columns as I get additional information and material.

Now get out your ultraviolet light and see what you can find "When The Lights Go Out."

Reporting the Rarities by Gene Trink's

It's time for another update to RoR. Last May I promised another update in the fall, but there weren't enough reports in the interim to justify another column. Recent reports result in updates for eight of the listings, so here they are.

As you know, there isn't enough space to list all varieties that are scarce, so I limit this list to those that have very few, if any, mint singles or strips reported. Even so, there are some rarities that aren't listed and there are listed items that have such large reported quantities that I may drop them in the future in favor of other items that are also very rare.

For now though, this list will continue with the items we have been tracking for some years now. I invite readers to comment on the advisability of making changes. Send me a note (address on masthead page) or drop a line to the editor with your thoughts.

So here are the varieties which have changed counts as of May 23, 2018. New totals for FOP 78777 10/10 and FOP 13231A 10/10 vp; (5¢) Avery Mountain V333342 13L/12R; (10¢) Eagle & Shield STD 11111 round shoulder die; (10¢) Atlas V13222; 37¢ Snowy Egret V2121 Valley/Peak; 37¢ Snowy Egret V3211 Valley/Peak; and 37¢ Snowy Egret P2222 Multi-tie.

As always, I encourage members to search their holdings for examples of these items, as I'm convinced that there are many more to yet come to light. This is particularly important for those new members who have joined within the last year, since they may not have seen a previous list.
