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President's Message

Gene Trinks, chairman of the nominating committee, has informed me that we have one person running for office for each of Board of Directors positions. We have Tom McFarland running for president, John Himes for vice president, Dan Farrar for secretary and Melvyn Borofsky for treasurer.

This issue has the list of members who have been dropped by the club for nonpayment of dues. Please take a look at the list and if you know anyone on it, try to contact them to see if maybe it was an oversight.

Also, in this issue, we have our semi-annual club auction. This is a good place to pick up some unusual items and to fill some spaces at a lower price. But, you have to be a current member in order to participate. Check it out when you get a chance. Also, remember to thank Joe Sedivy for all his hard work in putting these auctions together.

Brief note: I sent off a strip of five of the 2017 Flag and a sheet of the new version of the Forever Hearts (they are both counterfeit) to be expertized. On the submittal form I noted that they were both counterfeit. I also noted that I wanted them to show that this version of the Forever Hearts sheet was different from the previous version.

I got the certificate back for the 2017 flag with nothing unusual. However, on the Hearts sheet, I got something back that I didn't expect. The certificate stated "This is not a postal counterfeit; rather, it is a never hinged Scott 4955, a genuine normal sheet." At a minimum, I would have expected it to say that the sheet was untagged, but it said it was "Normal." The sheet has been viewed and verified by several people who all agree it is counterfeit. The sheet was also written up in *Linn's* recently as a counterfeit. This was a very disappointing outcome.

PNC³ Elections Slated for June

2018 is an election year for the Executive Board of PNC³. Board members serve two-year terms, with terms starting in September. Voting takes place in June, the votes are tallied in July and results announced at the annual meeting in August.

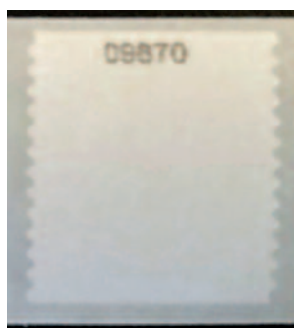

**2¢ Meyer Lemons (BCA) (SA)
Plate B11111
PNC ID 2018-1**



The 2-cent Meyer Lemons coil was issued January 19, 2018 in Kenner, LA 70062 and nationwide in 10K rolls. It carries a B11111 plate number indicating it is a Banknote Corporation of America product. This is a self-adhesive make-up stamp replacing the 2-cent Navajo Jewelry stamp (2011-2) which had water-activated gum (WAG). Use Item Number 760415 to order uncut strips of 500 from Philatelic Fulfillment in Kansas City, MO.

The B11111 plate number repeats every 28th stamp.

The stamp is untagged and mounted on a liner that is higher than the stamp itself. "USPS" is microprinted to the left of the bottom lemon wedge.

Five-digit back numbers occur every 10 stamps on the back of the liner with the highest back numbers on the outside of the roll. As shown, both top and bottom back numbers exist. All the back numbers are five digits in length. Of the two contract printers, only BCA still uses top and bottom back numbers on their coils.

When purchasing a 10K roll, it's not possible to tell whether a particular roll has top or bottom back numbers. Because the plate interval is an even number (28) and the back number is also even (10 stamps apart), some rolls will have even back numbers (i.e. back number may be behind a plate numbered stamp and other rolls will have odd back numbers where a back number will never be on the plate numbered stamp).

Bookend strips are only found on odd rolls. (A bookend strip is a plate strip of 11 with the plate number on the center stamp and back numbers on the first and last stamps in the strip.) Number-on-number PNCs are only found on even rolls at 140 stamp intervals.

When the Lights Go Out

This month we will look at the four types of tagging: block tagging, overall tagging, embedded tagging and surface tagging. The four types can be divided into two groups because the two groups are produced very differently.

Block tagging and overall tagging (Figure 1) are produced by printing phosphorescent clear ink on top of the stamp image. This clear ink layer made it easy for cancels to be removed and the stamp reused. The rectangular block tagging reduced wear on the perforation pins.

Overall tagging covers the entire surface of the stamp and is grainy in appearance.

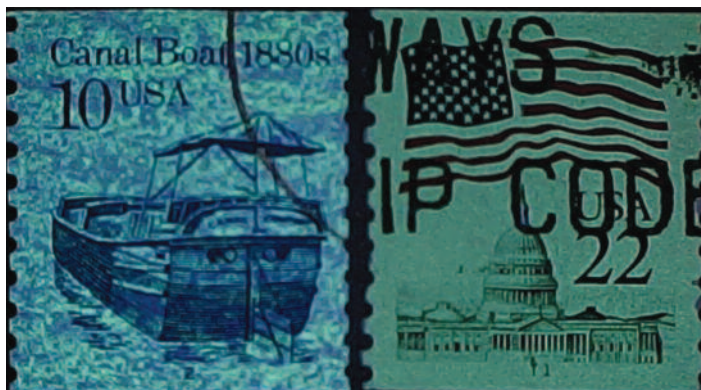

Embedded tagging and surface tagging (Figure 2) are part of the paper when delivered to the printers and the stamp image is printed on top of the phosphorescent surface. Doing away with the clear ink layer allows the cancel ink to absorb better into the paper and reduces stamp reuse.

Embedded tagging has the phosphorescent penetrating into the paper. It is also known as blotchy or mottled.

Surface tagging has the phosphorescent applied to the surface of the paper. Also known as smooth or solid.

Some stamp issues are known with more than one type of tagging. A good example is the 10¢ Canal Boat that has all four types of tagging and can also be found untagged.

Next month we will start looking at some of the tagging varieties that can be found "When The Lights Go Out."

ORCOEXPO Meeting Report

Fullerton, California – January 13, 2018

A great time was had by all at our recent PNC³ club meeting at the ORCOEXPO stamp show. The meeting was hosted by Dan Forgues, Jeff Haas and Frank Covey and myself with 18 members and guests attending. The agenda was jam-packed and it was interesting having to run the air conditioner in the meeting room. It was 90 degrees outside! You've gotta love southern California!

Frank shared information on the upcoming Meyer Lemon and Flag coils. He asked those in attendance what they felt we should call this new flag issue and the consensus seemed to be "Zig-Zag Flag 2018." Frank also provided the USPS order number for a strip of 500 of the Meyer Lemon Stamp: 760415.

Dan did an encore presentation of his "What Makes it Rare?" slide show. The response was extremely positive and those present urged Dan to write a series of articles for **Coil Line** to present this information to everyone in the club.

Frank talked about the sawtooth separators that can be found on the newer "stick" coils and showed how to distinguish them from the traditional "stick" coils that have small ties every few stamps rather than the continuous "saw cuts" that appear on the sawtooth variety.

Dan showed an image of a counterfeit Star-Span-



gled Banner Forever stamp he found in a recent mixture. It was untagged and lacked the "USPS" microprinting. It also had very crude die cutting (See figure at left).

Dan and I demonstrated how to remove "stubborn" self-adhesive stamps from their backing

paper using Pure Citrus Orange air freshener (Part #NA222). The key is to spray the air freshener on the stamps in a glass or ceramic dish and let it sit for awhile before trying to remove the stamp. All six stamps in the demonstration easily came off the backing paper after a 45-minute "soak" in Pure Citrus during the meeting. (If you don't already have a can, they're available from Home Depot and Walmart.)

John explained how to keep "lick and stick" stamps from curling after water soaking by placing them (while still very slightly damp) between layers of blotter paper and applying gentle pressure for several hours.

Dan showed some pictures of "foxing" on PNCs and explained how to deal with this issue.

I brought examples of the recent Father Hesburgh stamp that were torn on the right edge by automated postal equipment. I warned everyone that the time to get a used plate number example of this stamp is now. It will probably be very hard to find in the future due to the low print run and the problem with the stamps tearing in the mail stream.

Throughout the two hours allotted, there were a number of questions from those in attendance, and the hosts did their best to give an authoritative answer to each question.

At the end of the meeting, door prizes were given to all who attended. Many thanks to dealer/member Dave Cobb who donated two nice imperf pairs of the Flag and Cloud (Scott #5052) stamp of 2016 as well as to other members who pitched in with donations. Following the door prize giveaway, there was some robust trading and selling among the members.

Overall, it was a wonderful meeting and we want to thank all who attended and helped make it an interactive and informative meeting. If you have been thinking about hosting a PNC³ meeting in your area, we'll be glad to help you with the needed planning and ideas for a successful meeting. Don't be shy! Just ask!

Meyer Lemons 2018-1

Frank Covey

To collect the 2-cent Meyer Lemons (2018-1) it is not necessary to buy a full 10K roll. Philatelic Fulfillment in Kansas City, MO is selling uncut strips of 500. Use item number 760415 to order an uncut strip of 500.



Here's a picture of the box these come in. The first boxes of 500 to come from Kansas City have had either even top or even bottom back numbers. An even back-numbered roll will have a #on# strip every 140 stamps along the roll. Collectors ordering these first boxes will most likely get three #on# strips.

If you have not been collecting back numbered sets, the Meyer Lemons issue would be a good place to start. A two-cent stamp won't break the bank.

A back numbered set is defined as a set of plate numbered strips of 5 or more where the back number (either top or bottom on 2018-1) moves across the strip. I cut my back numbered strips into strips of 11. On the Meyer Lemons issue it takes 5 strips to make a set of PS11. I mount these strips of 11 in Garant 829 pages I purchase from Safe Publications.

I try to get back number sets from odd and even rolls and rolls with both top and bottom back numbers. If you want tips on how to find all these four combinations, please email me at ecoilline@comcast.net and I will assist you.

2B or Not to 2B: The Code Decoded

Until now, all the coil stamps discussed in this column have had plate numbers that were one or two digits in length and printed in a single color. The 21.1¢ “Envelopes” stamp (Scott #2150), issued on October 22, 1985, was the first coil stamp with more than two digits and each digit was printed in a different color. What was going on?

This stamp was the first U.S. multicolor gravure coil stamp. The gravure printing method etches an image onto a cylinder or, if photogravure, onto a copper plate. The resulting depressions are filled with ink and the paper pressed into the inked depression with one cylinder or plate for each color. Thus, each digit in the plate number

for Scott #2150 represents one of the cylinders or plates. When a cylinder or plate is replaced, a new digit is assigned to that cylinder or plate. For Scott #2150, the plate numbers were 111111 and 111121. Each of the six digits represents one of the six colors used in the printing of this stamp. (The leading yellow digit is particularly difficult to see, usually requiring a magnifier and bright light.) These same plate numbers appear on this stamp’s precanceled cousins, Scott #2150a (untagged) and #2150b (tagged).

It is easy to imagine that for a workhorse stamp with a long print run, one could get quite an array of numbers pretty quickly. Indeed, as we will see in a future column, one such issue resulted in plate numbers all the way up to 1412111111.

Going beyond the numbers, what about letters? We have already seen the use of a “T” inscription on the 22¢ Flag Over Capitol Dome (Scott #2115c) to refer to a “test coil.” Some plate numbers on stamps produced by the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) have also included capitalized letters, such as A or B, that appear after (to the right of) the plate number. The BEP used these numbers to show that the single digits (one for each color/printing cylinder) of a multi-digit cylinder combination had exceeded nine. (Ref:

The Plate Number Coil Catalog Numbering System, pnc.org). These were used, for instance, with the 33¢ Flag over City stamp (Scott #3281), issued in 1999. Unlike the “T” for the test coil, these letters are considered part of the plate number.

As private companies began to be used more and more for printing stamps, letters were added before (to the left of) the plate number to indicate the company responsible for the printing. These letters are not considered to be part of the plate number. I have selected

Scott # 2599b, issued in 1994, as an example, simply because this colorful Statue of Liberty design has always been one of my favorites. This self-adhesive stamp was issued in both booklet and coil variety. Once removed from its backing paper, the only way to distinguish the coil from the booklet variety is if the coil stamp has the plate number, which is

D1111. This stamp was printed by Dittler Brothers, Inc.

On modern coils, some of the most commonly found letters are “V” for Avery Dennison, “P” for Ashton Potter, “S” for Sennett Security Products and “C” for CCL Label, Inc. (which acquired Sennett Security Products in October 2015.) In summary, the letters that appear with the plate numbers are sometimes considered to be part of the plate number, but usually they are a code that provides information about something else.

With that, I leave you with a silly joke: What starts with a “P” and ends with “E” and has millions of letters? The post office, of course! Please email your comments and ideas to me at PNCsAreCool@gmail.com or at least email me a better joke!

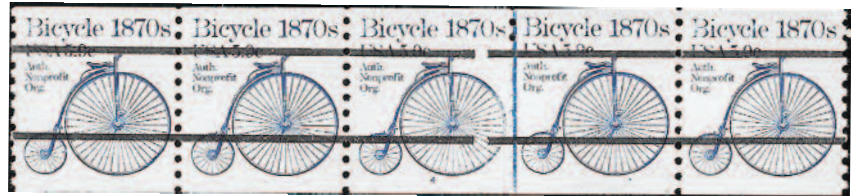
