2005 PNC Values list is ready

The 2005 edition of the Values List is offered in this issue of *Coil Line*. The list is only available for sale to PNC³ members, but members may buy more than one list. The Values List is being offered according to the schedule shown on the Values List Order Form. Please allow 4 weeks for delivery. (Form attached to front).

Four documents totaling about 100 pages make up this offering. These are the Values List Introduction, PNC Values, Back Number Values, and Precancel Gap Values. The main Values List shows prices for mint plate strips of 5 (PS5), mint PS3, Used Singles and Covers.

Cover prices are presented as a range of values instead of a set price. For example, a cover might be listed as 10-20 meaning that it should sell from \$10 to \$20. As explained in the Introduction to the Values List, many variables go into pricing a cover. PNC³ is indebted to Rob Washburn and Bill Castle for making these estimates available.

The Back Number List shows values for #on# strips and back numbers on a PS5. Some issues are collected as PS9 or PS11. Where appropriate, values for these longer strips are shown. Some issues with back numbers have no back number within a strip of 5. These strips are listed and noted. The back number list shows all issues known with back numbers.

New this time is the Precancel Gaps List. The catalog committee is unsure of the interest level in precancel gaps. If you have any interest in gaps, it's best to get this list as it may not be published with the same regularity as the other two lists. The gaps list attempts to show all known gaps.

All the lists are in face value sequence. Common fields on all lists are the PNC ID, Scott Number, Description and Notes. The values shown are median values compiled from multiple dealers' lists. Those dealer lists used are listed at the end of the Introduction. As mentioned previously, cover prices are shown on the main Values List as a

range of values. My feeling is that values are most accurate for the lower value items. As value increases items are less frequently traded and a true cost is harder to establish.

Remember the values shown are retail values, i.e. what you might expect to pay to purchase an item. These are the values you should insure your collection for. When selling a collection to a dealer do not expect to get the values shown.

The sales price for the 2005 Values Lists is very near cost. Whether the club breaks even on this offering will be determined by how many copies are sold. Our printing costs per copy go down as cumulative volume increases.

Lots of work by PNC³ members went into producing these lists for your benefit. With so much data to interpret, collect and enter, there are bound to be errors. If you see errors, please point them out to the Catalog Committee or myself. You can e-mail all members of the committee at catalog@pnc3.org. There is also a feedback form sent with each order. Please take time to fill this out and return it.

Up and Away

Color shifts typically occur at press start-up before the colors can all be brought into proper alignment. In the case of the two self-adhesive (10c) Green Bike stamps pictured below, the purple is out of alignment. On both stamps the purple is shifted up, but on the stamp on the right it is also shifted to the left. Since the purple 1 is very slightly to the left of the black 1, it could technically be considered a hopper (color order of the digits of the plate number is out of order).




Seacoast Spots

A number of people have reported finding stray magenta spots on the new Sennett version of the self-adhesive (5c) Seacoast stamps (2004 year date). The example pictured below from Ken Moreau shows a spot in the upper left margin of one such stamp.



37c Flag Large Roll Centering Shift

A lot has been written about the sudden shift in centering found in self-adhesive rolls of 100 from the BEP. Eugene Liu has found a sudden centering shift on the Sennett version of the self-adhesive 37c Flag from a roll of 3000 (2004 year date with space between stamps) where the centering goes from XF left of the shift to FVF right of the shift. In both cases the stamp designs are regularly spaced, but the die cutting takes a sudden shift. The sudden shifts on the rolls of 100 produce neighboring stamps of different widths, but in this case the stamps are all the same width and it is the width of the empty space between stamps that changes - specifically the width between the 5th and 6th stamp to the left of the numbered stamp is 1/2 mm wider than the rest. Since it is hard to get a good image of the white stamp border against the white liner, I've made up a made up a rough drawing below (the larger rectangles are the stamp borders and the smaller rectangles are the stamp designs).

As we begin the new year, I believe a quick review of the need for this survey is in order. Each of the above die varieties are extremely rare. This is in spite of the fact that the basic stamp designs are of recent issue. The mainstream catalog publishers do not recognize these varieties in spite of their scarcity. One reason I've heard given is that few people are interested in the peak and valley locations, only in the gauge (as in perf gauge). Seems strange that stamps that have no perforations should be cataloged using a perforation gauge. The peak and valley counts are easier to accomplish and more accurately reflect the inverted and reversed placement of the die cutting mats that result in these rarities.

It also seems mighty strange that the sophisticates in the hobby who salivate over distinct perf varieties on classic (or more modern) stamps should not recognize an inverted placement of a die cutting mat on our modern PNCs. Or that the use of a die with a different shape should not receive any notice whatever. Granted, a cutting die is not a perforation wheel, but it serves the same purpose. It is the modern day equivalent. Different dies should receive as much recognition as different perf wheels, and the stamps thereby produced should be granted the same catalog recognition.

If the mainstream philatelists are to recognize the importance of these modern scarcities, we must show them the inherent logic of the above, and be persistent in calling for the recognition of these modern rarities.


