# 37c Flag coil is last printed on BEP's Andreotti press

(Editor's Note: The following has been prepared based on information in the June 20 issue of Linn's Stamp News and Ken Lawrence's 1990 Linn's Plate Number Coil Handhook.

Coils of 100 37c Flag stamps were the last stamps to be produced by the U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing early in June. In its final contract with the U.S. Postal Service the BEP was printing 5 billion of the Flag stamps this year. A BEP official told *Linn's* it was unknown if the stamps would be needed before the rate change expected early in 2006.

It was unknown at this writing what plate numbers were used on this printing. Plate information from the BEP has been extremely difficult to obtain for many years. Many collectors would like to know this information. It would be worth noting this in collections because the BEP has been the chief printer of U.S. stamps for more than a century. There's always the possibility that this final stamp will have some sort of microprinting or other feature that will be announced or collectors will discover.

According to Lawrence's book, the first PNCs produced on the Andreotti press were the 'D' rate change stamps. Among later printings were the 18c George Washington Monument stamp, the 21.1c Letters and the 'E' Earth rate change stamp.

Also produced on the Andreotti press were the 20c Birds and Flowers, the 15c Coral Reefs, the 18c Space Achievements and the 20c Balloons.

Lawrence wrote that the first three coils 'D,' Washington and Letters "were duds, poorly printed and unpopular with users and collectors alike."

The BEP apparently will try to sell the Andreotti press but some doubt the 35-year-old equipment will find a buyer. Last year the BEP ended up scrapping its F press when it was shut down. BEP officials have said they plan to maintain records in its Historical Resources Center.

### Album issue gets another hearing

To the Editor:

A good stamp album is instructive, essentially complete, reasonably often brought up to date, reasonably inexpensive and is downright fun to work with. It is certainly more challenging to fill blank spaces in an album than to stick stamps in a stock book.

Lighthouse had a good coil album, even though it was a bit expensive, and did not come out with supplements often enough. Stopping its publication was a real tragedy, since there is no satisfactory album now available.

Scott has an album that is complete in a sense, and has timely supplements, but the layout is crazy. The descriptions of the stamps are inside the frame lines, so that once a stamp is mounted you can't tell much about it. Not even the Scott Number. You can't use dark mounts, and to find anything about a stamp you have to take it out of the clear mount to read what is underneath. All they would have to do is print the information outside the frame lines and they would have a satisfactory album. It shouldn't cost them any more to print it this way. Since very few collect strips of three anymore, they might also extend the frame lines to outline a coil strip of five.

I called Scott customer relations and suggested that they do this, and the girl who answered the phone was rude and incensed. She informed me that the album was perfect and that they would not consider changing it. It would seem to me that if enough dealers and collectors made these suggestions that they might get results.

Meanwhile, I will continue to write this information in pencil beside the mounts.

Some major news on the Flag Over Porch rarities this month! A Florida collector has reported (and verified with pictures) 10 (yes, that's TEN!) used copies of the 78777 10/10 die! That brings the total reported of this elusive stamp to 56. To make things even better, another used #66666 with the 10/11 die surfaced in a west coast collector's hands (only 18 of these reported so far). The Florida collector stated that he's had them for some time, but did not recognize the prizes hidden away in his collection.

I'm glad that members are taking a more active role in this census. These are true rarities comparable to the rare perforation varieties from the early 20<sup>th</sup> century always touted in the mainstream philatelic press. If you have one or more of these in your collection, you need to know it!

Other finds have been sparse this month. One more used Atlas #V12111 has turned up, and three Eagle & Shield STD #11111 with rounded shoulder on cover, with the rest of the list standing at last month's totals.



- Sennett's SA Llon S55555 was printed with a different size cylinder than the other plate numbers. Consequently the plate number interval changed from 21 to 20.
- Ashton Potter's SA Seacoast P2222 was die cut with two different mats. One is serpentine cut on all four sides while the other has serpentine cuts on the sides and straight cuts on top and bottom.
- In printing the SA Seacoast with cylinders P2222, P3333 and P4444 Ashton Potter changed the cylinder size from that used to print P1111. Consequently the plate number intervals changed from 22 to 27. P3333 & P4444 have small date and color laydown BCMY.
- ■The Kestrels differ in the order of color laydown. Colors are black, yellow, cyan and magenta, Type I sequence is BYCM. Type II is BCYM. Type III is YMCB. The color order shows in the plate number.



Gene Trinks provided this scanned image while at the Plymouth Regional Meeting. It is obviously a green on gold non-denominated American Eagle (PNC ID 2003-6), but what is the source and purpose of the black 7-digit number just above the eagle's head?

Why is 0015522 on this coil?



Above is the "Ski slope" variety of the 25c Yosemite with plate number 5 from Conrad Keydel's collection.

Note the tree tops above USA are missing and that the unprinted area continues through the trees to the left of USA giving the impression of a mountain ski slope.



A normal Yosemite with plate number 8 is shown above for comparison.


